Students will read and act out a short play before creating their own. Focuses on enhancing literacy skills and encouraging exploration and expression through drama, music, dance, and improvisation.







Students will enjoy a novel as a group and individually. They will complete activities based on the book.



HOMEWORK CLUB INFORMATION

Just a reminder that the Homework Club is designed to support parents who may have a younger child in an ASA and an older child who isn't in an ASA on the same day. This is to prevent parents from having to come at 2.15pm and then again at 3pm. The Homework Club would allow the child to attend and finish at the same time as their younger sibling, being 3pm.


It is important to note that the Homework Club will be supervised by a teacher, but that teacher may not be a subject specialist in the work that is being done by your child. Their role will be to simply supervise and support in any way they can.

The conditions of registering for the Homework club are:

- The students registering must have another sibling who is attending an ASA on the same day.
- To register for the Homework club, parents must email secondary.asa@oryxschool.qa with the following information:
- Name & year group of your child attending Homework Club.
- The day they wish to attend.
- Name of the club other sibling is attending.

You only need to register your child for Homework club once but please note if they miss more than 3 sessions, we will notify parents to check if they still require a place.

What is the cost of the ASAs?

All ASAs provided by the school are free. External providers have their own fees.

Is the school bus transportation available for ASAs?

Not at this time, the pickup of students after the activity will be the responsibility of the parents. **Not later than 3PM**

Is it mandatory for my child to participate in any activity?

Children's participation in ASAs is completely optional.

Do I need to bring anything specific for my child ASAs?

We recommend that parents ensure their children have comfortable shorts, T-shirts, socks, and running shoes for any sports activities. For outdoor activities, a cap and a water bottle are also essential. Our staff will provide guidance on whether any additional equipment is required or if there is a need to purchase any specific kit.
