What is the Critical Language Scholarship (CLS) Program?

The CLS Program provides opportunities for American college and university students to study languages and cultures essential to America's engagement with the world. Each summer, American undergraduate and graduate students enrolled at U.S. colleges and universities across the country, spend eight to ten weeks learning one of a dozen languages at an intensive study abroad institute. CLS is designed to promote rapid

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language gains and essential intercultural fluency in regions that are critical to U.S. national security and economic prosperity.

CLS Spark, an initiative of CLS, provides opportunities for American undergraduate college and university students to study Arabic, Chinese, Korean, Japanese, and Russian virtually at the beginning level. Designed to leverage best practices in online language learning, CLS Spark provides students with the opportunity to study critical languages virtually when they may not have access to studying these languages on their campuses.

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Section 1: Program Overview and Requirements

Critical Language Scholarship Program

The Critical Language Scholarship (CLS) Program is sponsored by the [U.S. Department of State](#) with funding provided by the U.S. Government. It is supported in its implementation by [American Councils for International Education](#).

The CLS Program provides opportunities for American college and university students to study languages and cultures essential to America's engagement with the world. Through immersive study abroad, the CLS Program is designed to promote rapid language gains. CLS Program scholars develop essential intercultural fluency in regions that are critical to U.S. national security and economic prosperity.

Each summer, American undergraduate and graduate students enrolled at U.S. colleges and universities spend eight to ten weeks in intensive study abroad institutes in a dozen critical languages around the world.

The CLS Program reserves the right to change or cancel any or all program institutes based on safety, health, and security considerations, and other factors.

Depending on health and safety considerations, the U.S. Department of State may choose to hold some or all of the 2025 CLS institutes virtually. In completing this application, you will be considered for the 2025 CLS Program for your chosen target language based on the existing selection criteria, regardless of program format.

Who is Eligible for the CLS Program?

To be eligible for the CLS Program applicants must:

- Be a U.S. citizen or national at the time of application.
 - Others, including Permanent Residents, are not eligible, even if they anticipate naturalization by the beginning of the program.
- Be at least 18 years old by May 15, 2025.
- Be enrolled in an accredited U.S. degree-granting program at the undergraduate (associate, bachelor's) or graduate (master's, doctoral, professional degree) level at the time of application. Students who are graduating seniors at the time of application and students enrolled in one-year master's programs are eligible to apply.
 - Applicants must be enrolled in a program that results in a degree. Applicants who are taking stand-alone or continuing education classes or who are pursuing a certificate are not eligible.
 - Applicants must be enrolled at an accredited U.S. institution. Students earning degrees at foreign institutions that are not based in the U.S. or its territories are not eligible, even if those institutions are accredited by a recognized U.S. accrediting agency. For students enrolled in

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dual-degree programs in which they take some courses at a U.S. institution and some courses at an international institution, students who can produce a transcript from the U.S. institution will be considered eligible.

- Applicants must be enrolled in at least one credit-bearing class at or through their home institution in the fall term of 2024. There are limited exceptions to the enrollment requirement; please read the following information carefully:
 - If applicants are enrolled in a degree-granting program but taking a leave of absence to participate in an organized term- or year-long study abroad program; national scholarship or fellowship program; or to participate in a substantive internship program, they may request an exception to the enrollment requirement. Exceptions may only be granted in these three cases, and decisions will be made on a case-by-case basis beginning in late January.
 - **If applicants are not taking classes at or through their home institution in the fall term, they must submit a CLS Enrollment Confirmation form completed by their home registrar in the U.S. Applicants must also submit a signed letter from the program provider explaining the opportunity and confirming their participation. American Councils will provide the CLS Enrollment Confirmation form and further instructions to applicants selected as semi-finalists. If selected as a finalist, American Councils may ask the finalist to submit updated documentation from the program provider confirming their successful completion of the program.**
- Applicants must successfully complete academic requirements for the fall term in order to remain eligible for the CLS Program. Applicants who withdraw or fail to maintain a passing grade average are not eligible to participate in the program.
- Applicants in an undergraduate program (associate or bachelor's) must complete at least one full year of study (two semesters or three quarters) by the beginning of the CLS Program in Summer 2025.
- Applicants must meet the language requirements of the program to which they apply.
- Applicants may only apply once, for one language and for one of CLS' models (i.e., Overseas or Spark), each year. Applicants who submit multiple applications will be considered ineligible.

Who is Ineligible for the CLS Program?

The following persons are ineligible for the CLS Program for a period ending one year following the termination of such employment, association, or service:

- **Employees of the U.S. Department of State/U.S. Agency for International Development.** This provision includes all employees, paid or unpaid (including part-time or temporary employees, consultants, externs, fellows and personal services contractors). This provision does not apply to interns.
- **Immediate family members (e.g., spouses or dependent children) of employees of the U.S. Department of State/U.S. Agency for International Development are ineligible.** This provision includes immediate family members of all employees, paid or unpaid (including part-time or

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temporary employees, consultants, externs, fellows and personal services contractors). This provision does not apply to immediate family members of interns.

- Non-dependent children are eligible to participate, provided that their parents do not work directly on the Critical Language Scholarship Program.
- **Employees (and their immediate family members) of private and public agencies under contract or grant with the U.S. Department of State to perform services on behalf of the Critical Language Scholarship Program programs are ineligible.** This includes employees who do not work directly on the program. This provision does not apply to immediate family members of interns.

Military Affiliation

The CLS Program welcomes applicants with affiliation to the U.S. armed services. All applicants with military affiliation, including all U.S. Department of Defense military and civilian personnel, service academy cadets, service members of active and reserve components, as well as inactive service members, including members of the Individual Ready Reserves (IRR), may be subject to passport or visa requirements, special waiver requirements, prohibition of travel to the host country, and/or other restrictions. Prior to completing the CLS application, all applicants with affiliation to the U.S. armed forces should carefully review the CLS Program's instructions on this topic (<https://clscholarship.org/faqs>) and seek advice from the appropriate commanding officer.

Participation Requirements

The health and well-being of participants and staff are top priorities of CLS. The CLS Program is a rigorous immersion program and may be physically and emotionally challenging. Each student must be committed to working hard and participating fully in the group program, beginning with the mandatory pre-program orientation through the completion of the program.

With reasonable accommodations, participants in the CLS Program must:

- Be able to stay alert and to focus attention for up to several hours at a time during classes, while participating in cultural activities, and when receiving staff instructions;
- Attend the pre-program orientation and all daily classes and activities, as dictated by the program schedule and for the duration of the program (program dates will be announced prior to the deadline for accepting the award, if offered);
- If taking prescription medications, be able to maintain proper dosage without assistance from instructors or others (except in emergency situations);
- Perform necessary self-care, including maintaining adequate nutrition and hydration, dressing appropriately for environmental conditions, maintaining personal hygiene, and managing known medical conditions;
- Comprehend and follow detailed instructions on travel, risk management, personal care, hazard avoidance, and other topics;
- With reasonable accommodations, be able to navigate transportation independently between program-provided housing and the institute site, a maximum of approximately one hour each way;
- Work effectively as a member of a team despite potentially stressful and difficult conditions. This may require problem solving on an interpersonal or group level as well as a willingness to accept differences;

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- Contribute to a safe learning environment. No inappropriate verbal or physical behavior toward others, either in person or online, is tolerated for any reason; and
- Effectively communicate ideas and concerns on an individual and group level.

Note that some program dates may overlap with the spring or fall academic term at participants' institutions. Therefore, it may be necessary for participants to work with their institution to accommodate the program dates.

Medical Review

If selected for the CLS Program award, you will be required to submit a medical information form and physician's statement to the CLS Program for review by an independent medical professional. Results of the medical review will determine if you meet medical requirements necessary for program placement and participation in the CLS Program. You must also inform the program of any changes in your health status between submission of these forms and the start of the program in order to participate.

Passports, Visas, and Entry Requirements

Participants in the CLS Program must enter the host country on a U.S. passport. In most cases it is not possible for individuals with dual citizenship to participate in the country of their other nationality due to host country laws or policies requiring citizens to enter the country using the passport issued by that country alone. In some cases, this may also apply to participants whose parents hold citizenship in the host country. Applicants are responsible for determining whether they have, or are eligible to have, dual citizenship with the host country, and to address any potential consequences before accepting a CLS award.

Where necessary, participants in the CLS Program must also receive an appropriate visa from the host country (deadlines vary by country) and must meet all local requirements to enter the country legally for the purposes of participating on the CLS Program.

- **The CLS Program, American Councils for International Education and the U.S. Department of State will assist finalists with their visa applications, but cannot influence a foreign government's decision of whether or not to issue a visa. The decision to issue a visa rests solely with the government and consular mission of the country to which an individual is traveling.**
- Finalists and, in some cases, alternates may be required to work closely with program staff on preparing their paperwork well in advance of regular deadlines in order to receive a visa.
- Failure to meet deadlines or respond in a timely manner to CLS Program staff requests may result in not being issued a visa and therefore not being able to participate in the program.
- Finalists may be required to submit their passports for visa processing in the spring, prior to the program start date. This may require finalists to cancel or reschedule planned international travel in order to participate in the CLS Program.
- Finalists must also meet all other local requirements for entry on the visa status required for participation in the program; requirements may include but are not limited to vaccination requirements or negative tests for infectious disease.
- The U.S. Department of State is aware of countries that do not accept X gender passports, and their country pages on travel.state.gov provide details on available assistance at the nearest embassy or

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consulate. While the United States government issues passports with the X marker, it cannot guarantee your entry or transit through other countries. Before you travel, check with the foreign embassy or consulate in the United States for more information.

If you are selected for a CLS Program award, as a requirement of your participation, you must agree to the terms and conditions of the award. Program Benefits

Participants in the CLS Program will receive:

- Language instruction and cultural programming;
- Textbooks and language learning materials;
- Language gains certified using the widely recognized ACTFL OPI (Oral Proficiency Interview) assessment;
- Non-competitive eligibility for U.S. government employment for up to three years after program completion;
- Academic credit issued through Bryn Mawr College;
- International and domestic travel between the student's home city in the U.S. and the CLS Program site abroad;
- Visa application fees, where applicable; and
- Room, board, and program-sponsored travel within the host country or location.

Other expenses such as, but not limited to, will not be covered:

- U.S. passport fees (except for students who are eligible and apply for [CLS Passport Assistance](#));
- Cost of medical exams and any follow-up visits necessary to pass the medical review process, as determined by the CLS Program; and
- Cost of any immunizations required for entry, as well as costs for travel health clinic appointments.

Selection Criteria and Process

Applicants for the CLS Program will be selected on the basis of merit, with consideration for the following:

- Connection between language and goals;
- Contribution to the CLS Program goals of citizen diplomacy and mutual understanding;
- Preparation for the CLS Program;
- Adaptability, sensitivity, and resilience; and

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- Commitment to language learning.

All other factors being equal, the CLS Program gives preference to veterans of the United States armed forces.

All other factors being equal, applicants are selected from a wide range of U.S. States, D.C., and territories; colleges and universities; backgrounds; and fields of study.

Preference may be given to candidates with limited or no previous study abroad experience.

All applicants will be contacted in **late January** by email with a notification of whether their application passed the initial review process.

Finalists, alternates, and non-recipients will be notified of their statuses by email in **early March**.

Those selected for the award will have approximately two weeks to accept or decline. Alternates are promoted on a rolling basis throughout the spring.

Finalists and alternates will receive further information on program requirements, including the medical review and visa process, at this time.
