CSF Leaker Profiles

Last but never least, John Jackson and Leah Smith took to the stage today in our last instalment of the Leaker Profile and Life with a CSF Leak video.

John featured in a video earlier in the week, but returned today to talk a little more about his journey. He experienced a spontaneous leak that may be related to an incident while surfing.

He was successfully treated with glue patches but his issues returned with a rare presentation of a leak – a CSF venous fistula. He has surgery for this, thought to be the first of its kind in the UK.

Leah's leak journey started with an ill-fated diagnostic lumber puncture last year.

Conservative measures failed to ease her symptoms and she faced repeated obstacles to obtaining definitive treatment of her leak.

She's had three blood patches, only one of which was partially effective, and struggles daily with ongoing symptoms. You can see her video below.
