Maths news

Key Stage 3 and Year 10 students sat in their Block 6 quiz this week. They were tested on their knowledge of current and past topics. Additionally, they were able to take part in a brief peer improvement exercise, allowing them to learn from each other and enhance their knowledge further.

As **Year 8** students explored the field of statistics, they uncovered the intricate process of collecting, interpreting, and analysing data. From setting hypothesis, developing research questions to choosing the appropriate statistical methods, they gained a deeper understanding of how data can be used to draw meaningful insights and conclusions.







Year 10 students recalled how to use Pythagoras' theorem and trigonometric ratios to solve problems in right-angle triangles. Then they learnt the terminology and notation of simple vectors.

Year 11 and 13 students discussed the examination criteria and noted the materials they must bring. They consolidated their learning on various topics and set a rigorous study plan in order to be well prepared for the upcoming exam.


