COURSE PROGRAM:

The program is based on the material package "German with Hans Hase" („Deutsch mit Hans Hase“). The protagonist Hans Hase is the decisive identification figure for the little learners. He lives in a suitcase from which he visits at every lesson and in which he returns again and again at the end. Through Hans Hase the children find access to the foreign language, because Hans Hase speaks and understands only German. The children get to know Hans Hase through listening, singing, crafting and playing and they gently enter the world of the German language. The focus is on listening and understanding and having fun with the new language and culture.

Registration is possible until the course is full. A maximum of 25 participants can enrol in the course. The course takes place if at least 4 participants per course register.

TEACHER:
