


The class very much enjoyed attending the book fair and loved choosing their new reads for the summer. It was nice to see how enthused they were with new literature.



#### Slovene


Early years students are currently learning about animals - Živali.




Our last lesson was about wild animals where students played various games to help them remember new vocabulary faster.
