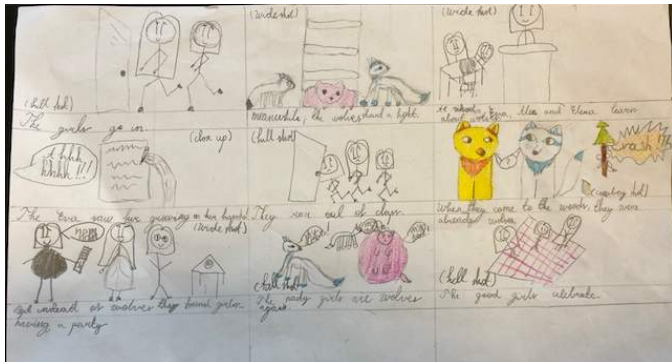


The students thoroughly enjoyed exercising their scientific muscles and look forward to more investigations next week as part of their 'Feel the Force' Topic.

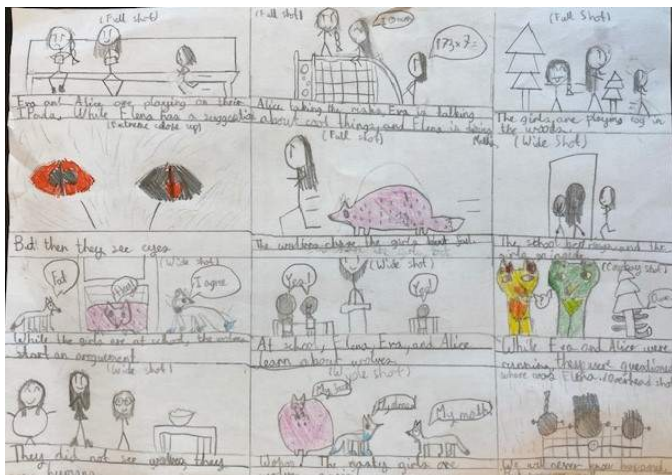

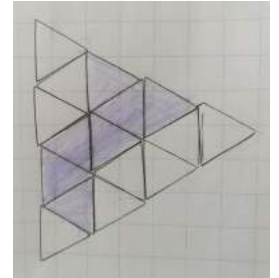

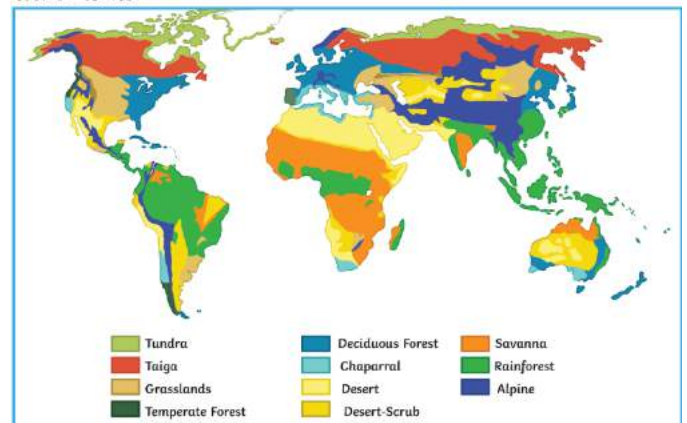
