## **Class Teacher Reports**

## **Early Years**

This week we started with a new topic, "Space", where students were learning all about Astronauts.













Nursery students were learning to name the parts of astronauts' space suits by cutting and sticking together the elements of a paper astronaut. Alongside practising their cutting skills, the students continued practising holding a pen with a tripod grip following the lines in the "Astronauts maze". In Maths, the students have been ordering numbers up to 10 and counting down from 10 to 0 with little help from number astronauts.

Our little Early Years astronauts have created and made the planets they want to land on with spongecolour prints. Pre-Nursery students continued to practice naming the shapes and creating paper space helmets, and role-playing going to a space. At the beginning of the week, the Reception students worked hard in Phonics lessons and learned about the letter "O".

On Thursday, they went on a very exciting trip to the Zoo with Year 2. Then, with the Easter holidays right around the corner, the Early Years students went on the egg hunt in the Woodland area, where they found and feasted on chocolate eggs brought in by parents.
