Are there opportunities to improve special education in your district?

Nearly 50 years since the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA), despite much hard work and investment, many districts continue to be challenged by a persistent achievement gap between students with disabilities and their non-disabled peers. But there is hope: when implemented with fidelity and integrated as a system, best practices can improve outcomes for both students with mild to moderate disabilities and students without disabilities and can be more cost effective.

Take this test and see if your district might have opportunities for improvement.
