

CLP Podcast 484 1/4/2022 Playing from the Big Blind Part 2 (PostFlop)

Intro:

Polk Neeme Owen discussion about buying the Lodge in Austin

Big Blind play (Postflop)

Headsup:

- Should be defending to sizing of 2/3 or less with any pair (five out draw) good quality gutshots flush draws OESD draws
 1. FLOP: Kd 5s 4d -- calling with any pair (watch the high kickers) diamond draws and like a 67 or say 63..
 2. FLOP: Td 5d 2c -- calling with any pair (watch the high kickers), diamond draws and 34
- To smaller sizing say 1/2 or 1/3 or less can defend with pocket pairs with backdoors and good gutshots,
 1. FLOP: Jd 5s 4d -- calling with any pair (watch the high kickers) diamond draws and like a 67 or say 63.. , 78 66-88 w diamond (watch backdoors) expand to 78, A3 and A4
 2. FLOP: 993ss.. Lots of ace highs as well
- Can check raise some draws depending on configuration and board texture
- Can check raise some protection
- Usually top pair that is static is taken for a call.. could be some high ace exceptions
- Some two pairs that favor pfr may be taken for a call
- Some slowplaying if the board favors opponents' range

Multiway

- The fact that someone bets into multiway opponents should make them stronger
- Overcalling has to be a super tight range, no piecing off with non-top pair types of hands only continue with top pair or better and good draws (very few exceptions) Ex 1: 76dd and board is Kd 2c 7h vs 23hh .. 8 out draws
- Less slowplaying
- Can play an attacking game after the pfr has checked
