Hi Bart,

I frequently play in loose passive \$1/2 no limit cash games with average stacks of about \$300 but ranging from \$40 to \$1,000. I always have at least \$400 (max buyin). Rake is 10% up to \$6 plus \$1 bad beat.

What do you think is the optimal preflop raise size from early position? Based on my experience we can assume that a 3bet is very unlikely unless the villain has top 2.5% of hands, and:

\$10 raise preflop will get an average of 4 callers (Pot \$50)

\$15 raise preflop will get an average of 2 callers (Pot \$45)

\$20 raise preflop will get an average of 1 caller (Pot \$40)

I often raise to \$15 plus \$2 for every limper and I have a very good win rate, but I'm trying to figure out if I can adjust to make even more.
