HAND HEWN BEAMS remind us of a time when nature and craftsmanship were closely intertwined. Before there were saws large or powerful enough to cut and shape big timbers, farmers and craftspeople took the laborious task of shaping them by hand using a broad axe and adze. The cut marks we see today are the original markings created by these hand tools.

Authentic original elements of the beams may include mortise pockets and peg holes, which can be patched or embraced as customer preferences require. Note: *Hand hewn beams are not intended for structural applications.*

SPECIES	Various hardwoods (Oak, Elm, Beech, Chestnut, Maple, Poplar, and others) Various softwoods (Heart Pine and Fir)
COLOR & TONE	Natural surface colors vary from ranges of gray and brown tones to black. Colors develop over the natural wood aging process, without the use of chemicals, dyes, or paint. Colors and tones vary from timber to timber. Color can be altered with colored oils or various proprietary treatments.
TEXTURE	Hand-tool marks • Distressed patina • Mortise pockets • Knots and checking • Nail holes
PRODUCT FEATURES	Denailed • Kiln-dried • Wire brushed
OPTIONS	Power washed • S1S - S3S wire brushed • Mortise pockets patched • Oil finish <i>Note: Material is sold unfinished unless otherwise specified.</i>
JANKA HARDNESS	Varies, dependent on species
DIMENSIONS	WIDTHS & HEIGHTS: General sizing nominal 6"x6" up to 12"x12", generally square. (Inquire about odd and larger sizes. Dependent on availability.) LENGTHS: Up to 27' (solid timbers, kiln-dried.) Longer lengths can be spliced together.
ORIGIN	All of our lumber is reclaimed from old barns, factories, and homes in the Eastern U.S. Wood is typically 100+ years old.
DISCLAIMER	Each reclaimed board is one-of-a-kind and can possess some or all of the aged characteristics. Variation is to be expected.
LIMITATIONS	Though reclaimed wood generally has a denser grain structure than new wood products, it does contain checks, marks, knotholes, nail holes, and color variations, as well as slight variations in thickness, typical of antique lumber. Please allow for these natural variations when designing the application.
