


VERTICAL GRAIN HEART PINE

The antique lumber is sawn perpendicular to the growth rings to achieve this special effect, producing a very durable wear surface with few knots (often called quartersawn or rift-sawn). This floor is our premium product with heart content above 90%. This beautiful wood floor will grow richer and darker each year.

GRAIN	Quartersawn producing a high-quality grade. May also be called straight grain, running in a single direction. Contains 90% heart content in our standard floor. More blonde wood content to match customer's floor available upon request.

ORIGIN	All of our lumber is reclaimed from old barns, factories, and homes in the Eastern U.S. Wood is typically 100+ years old.	
DISCLAIMER	Each reclaimed board is one-of-a-kind and can possess some or all of the aged characteristics. Variation is to be expected.	
LIMITATIONS	Though reclaimed wood generally has a denser grain structure than new wood products, it does contain checks, marks, knotholes, nail holes, and color variations. Please allow for these natural variations when designing the application.	

Note: Random nail holes, knots, nonstructural checks, and cracks are inspected by expert craftspeople to ensure that customers only receive our guaranteed quality product of usable footage.
