Science	Physical Education
Animals, including Humans Students learn that animals, including humans, have offspring which grow into adults. They will find out about and describe the basic needs of animals, including humans, for survival (water, food and air) They are able to describe the importance for humans of exercise, eating the right amounts of different types of food, and hygiene. Students learn about animal life cycles and how they vary for different species of animals.	In Gymnastics , students will be learning to coordinate their bodies, jumping, landing, rolling and turning. In racquet skills, they will learn to hold a racquet correctly and will start to develop their coordination when hitting objects. In football, they will learn how to dribble, pass and receive the ball in basic ways. In dodgeball, they will develop their throwing technique, reactions and agility when dodging.
