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Science	Physical Education
 Animals inc humans (skeletons, muscles, diet) Identify that animals, including humans, need the right types and amount of nutrition and that they cannot make their own food. They get nutrition from what they eat, food chains. Identify that humans and some other animals have skeletons and muscles for support, protection and movement. 	In swimming, students will learn basic water safety techniques and will start to develop their ability to swim on their front. In netball, they will develop their passing, receiving and movement skills. In tag rugby, they will develop their passing and receiving skills and their ability to time the pass in a 2 v 1 situation. In dodgeball, they will develop their throwing technique, agility, reaction time and catching skills. In hockey, they will start to learn to coordinate using a piece of equipment to dribble and pass the ball.
