Years 10 - 11 Key Stage 4

In Key Stage 4, at the start of Year 10, students begin their IGCSE studies and will take their external International General Certificate of Secondary Education (IGCSE) examinations at the end of Year 11.

Compulsory subjects:

- English Language and English Literature
- Mathematics
- Double Science (double award)
- Spanish

Students choose 3 options on top of their compulsory subjects. Flexible option groupings change annually depending on the interests of the given cohort.

Optional subjects:

- Triple Science
- Art & Design
- Business Studies
- Computer Science
- German
- French

- Catalan
- Geography
- History
- Music
- Physical Education GCSE
- Drama

Catalan is compulsory for students who hold a Spanish passport. All Year 10 and Year 11 students have to take sports twice a week. PE GCSE is a different subject and counts as an Option.

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Introduction Key Stage 4 - the IGCSE Options Process

Dear Year 9 Students,

This is the beginning of an important new phase in your education. It is the first time when you can actually make choices about the subjects you wish to study at IGCSE.

You have now reached a very important time in your education. You have to think carefully and make decisions about what courses you wish to study. We would like to take this opportunity to give you some advice that you may find useful. When you are choosing, please bear the following in mind:

Reasons for choosing a subject

Do choose a subject because:

- You will enjoy it.
- You have a strong interest in it.
- You are good at it.
- It will help you in your future career aspirations and plans.
- You believe that you will succeed in it.

Do not choose a subject because:

- Your friends have chosen it.
- You think it will be easy.
- You have been told it involves less work.
- Relatives or friends tell you to do it without a good reason.
- You just like your current teacher.
- You want to do something new for the sake of it.

It is very important to talk to relatives, teachers and friends to discuss your views.

Find out about different careers from your teachers about choices you are considering and discuss them with your family. Friends are very important to you but be very careful not to opt for subjects just to be with them.

Some of you may already have clear career ambitions and some of you may be worried because you do not. As you talk to adults about their careers so far you will find out that most are now doing a job that they did not really consider when they were 14 years old. As you go through life, you will follow many different paths as different opportunities arise.

Bearing this in mind it is important to make decisions now that offer a broad and balanced curriculum that will not limit your future career path too much, but you do have to make decisions and that means talking to lots of people and then being strong and bold.

The transition to Key Stage 4 is an exciting and memorable moment in your education. This is a time to shape your own education by selecting subjects that you enjoy or that will help you progress in your desired career path.

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Expectations

As a Key Stage 4 student, you will become senior members of the school, so it is important that you now consider yourselves as mature students that need to model positive behaviour, exemplary appearance and an outstanding attitude to learning.

Please think very carefully about all the information and advice which is given to you in the coming weeks and do not be afraid to ask about anything you need further help with. We want you to make the best possible choices so that you can go on to achieve your potential in both your studies and career.

The best advice I can give is simply, 'Do your homework' and listen to the advice of your teachers and the senior members of staff who will guide this process. Talk to your parents, talk to your teachers. Remember, though, that the real experts in this process are those who were faced with the same options last year or the year before; talk to students in Years 10 and 11. 
External Examinations IGCSE Grades Explained

Grading has recently moved to a 9-1 scale instead of the A*-G scaling. The highest grade is 9, while 1 is the lowest, not including a U (ungraded).

In the 9-1 grading system:

- 9 is higher than a current A*
- 8 is between and A* and A
- 7 is equal to an A
- 6 is equivalent to a high B
- 5 is between a B and C (strong pass)
- 4 is equal to a grade C (standard pass)
- 3 is in between a D and E
- 2 is between an E and F
- 1 is a G
- U refers to an ungraded paper

The table below compares the 9-1 grade scale to the A*-G grading structure:



* Please note, languages GCSE still use the old A*- U scale.

Course Overview

During your two years studying Art & Design at IGCSE level, you will learn a range of fine arts techniques, emphasising drawing, painting, photography and Photoshop. You will learn to develop your ideas by learning from other artists and being inspired by the world around you. Students can progress from this qualification to A Levels in Art and Design and other creative subjects.

The IGCSE syllabus provides the opportunity to explore some of the following:

Component 1 (coursework) This component gives students opportunities to:

- Develop and explore ideas
- Research primary and contextual resources
- Experiment with media, materials, techniques and processes
- Present personal response(s) to theme(s) set by the centre.

Component 2 (exam) This component allows students opportunities to:

- Develop and explore ideas
- Research primary and contextual resources
- Experiment with media, materials, techniques and processes
- Present personal response(s) to the extremally-set theme.

Assessment Details

For assessment, you will complete two components: Coursework (50%) and Exam (50%). Both components will be externally assessed.

Pearson Edexcel International Business Studies (4BS1)

Course Overview

Business studies is a very exciting subject to study as it helps prepare students for their futures in the world of work. All the topics that are covered in business relate to the real world and issues that impact on all of us. Edexcel IGCSE Business Studies 9-1 is accepted by universities, colleges and employers as evidence of a foundation knowledge of the world of business and everything connected with commercial activity.

Students will gain an insight into the workings of the modern world and how resources and materials are converted into the consumer products and services that make up our society.

The IGCSE syllabus is split into the following units:

- business basics, how they are set up, the different types of business and how they can grow into successful multinational companies
- the people in business and the importance of having good people in a business. How to organise the people within a business, motivate them and communicate with them in order to make a business successful
- basic business finance of how and where businesses source money from and how they keep track of all the money flowing in and out of a business and ensuring that they are a profitable business
- how businesses decide what to produce, how they develop these products and then sell to their customers. Should they charge a high or low price, where should they sell their products and how should they inform their customers about their product.
- production methods that businesses undertake in order to produce a high quality product in an efficient way and distribute it to their customers. How technology impacts on their production and what they are producing and how they are producing their products.

Students will also be encouraged to develop skills of analysis and evaluation rather than just learn lists of facts, so that they can assess and explain situations from evidence provided and arrive at their own conclusions using reason and advanced thinking skills. Students will be challenged to think for themselves and be able to discuss what they would want in a business and how they would handle different business situations.

Assessment Details

You will be assessed at the end of each unit with assessments taken from past IGCSE exam papers.

In Year 10 you will have internal examinations in November and June.

In Year 11 you will have 'mock' examinations in January. You will sit the final, external exams in the summer. You will have 2 written examination papers including multiple choice, data and essays.

Careers

The IGCSE course is an excellent foundation for studying Business Studies or Economics at A level and continuing further studies at University. Business Studies is often combined with other areas of study from Law to Politics and Fashion to Hotel or Sports Management. Studying business can lead students into a job in pretty much anything. The subject covers so much that it will prepare students for any future career.

Pearson Edexcel International English Literature (4ET1)

Course Overview

The IGCSE in English Literature exposes students to a range of literary texts from around the world. The course enables students to develop the ability to read, understand and respond to these texts with an appreciation of the ways in which writers achieve their literary effects. Students will develop the skills needed for literary study while exploring the relationships between literature and different cultures and societies.

4ET1 (Pearson Edexcel International GCSE in English Literature)

Assessment Details

All candidates take two papers: Component 1 (Poetry and Modern Prose) and Component 2 (Modern Drama and Literary Heritage Texts). All students will be eligible for grades 9 to 1.


Careers

Pearson Edexcel International English Language (4EA1)



Course Overview

The IGCSE in English Language enables students to read fluently and critically a wide range of texts while using the knowledge gained from reading to inform and improve their own writing. Students will develop their skills to write appropriately to text type, audience and purpose, using Standard English and correct spelling, punctuation and grammar. In addition, students will acquire and apply a wide vocabulary and demonstrate knowledge and understanding of how writers use language to affect readers.

The IGCSE specification

4EA1 (Pearson Edexcel International GCSE in English Language: Specification A)

Assessment Details

All candidates take two papers: Component 1 (Non-fiction Texts and Transactional Writing) and Component 2 (Poetry and Prose Texts and Imaginative Writing). All students will be eligible for grades 9 to 1.

Careers

A qualification in English is necessary for most careers where English is spoken, and the GCSE or IGCSE in English Language is necessary to study most A Levels. The Pearson Edexcel IGCSE is internationally recognised as an English Language qualification.

Pearson Edexcel International Geography (4GE1)

Course Overview

Geography is not just memorising countries' names. We are living at a very exciting time in human history. Geography offers us a unique way to make connections between coasts, exploding volcanoes and urban areas; how flooding and natural disasters affect food and transportation systems. Are you capable of making decisions in a global world? Are you current with the events that matter most? Come and explore in IGCSE geography!

The IGCSE syllabus and content:

In this class you learn about the awesome power of wind and waves; the crisis of climate change and extreme weather, how our cities get the power they need; and the realities of globalisation. If you want to gain a better sense of place and a stronger sense of self, geography is a good subject to start with.

Assessment Details

You will undertake 6 topics of study covering two themes: Physical Geography and Human Geography. The final exam is 2 papers in May/June of Year 11. Along the way you will have various chances to assess your progress and skills through short answer questions, group work, fieldwork in the outdoors, and of course smaller tests.

Pearson Edexcel International History (4HI1)



Course Overview

Studying history at IGCSE helps to develop an enquiring mind and gives you a much better understanding about how your world evolved. The subject helps to develop the skills to look beyond the headlines, to ask questions properly, and to express your own opinions. History students are rounded individuals who develop an understanding of both past and present. The pursuit of historical events and people is fun - a form of time travel.

The IGCSE syllabus and course content:

Students follow a modern world history course, looking at these major events that shaped the 20th century:

- A world divided: superpower relations, 1943-1972
- Germany: development of dictatorship, 1918–45
- The USA 1918-1943
- China: conflict, crisis and change 1900-89

Assessment Details

You will be assessed during and after each topic, usually every 4 to 5 weeks. All assessments are taken from past IGCSE exam papers.

The final exam consists of two papers in May/June at the end of Year 11.

Careers

Professions which look for a history qualification include politics, the law, journalism, the Civil Service and local government, teaching and heritage-related careers. A history qualification is also widely respected in the world of business, marketing and human resource management and increasingly in medicine and other scientific fields. Previous students have gone on to study Law, Politics, Business Studies, Journalism and International Relations.

Pearson Edexcel International Mathematics (4MA1)

Course Overview

IGCSE mathematics is a wide ranging and interesting course that is taught over three years at Baleares International College. Students can study the foundation tier or higher tier course. Concepts will appear in both courses; however, the maximum grade in the foundation tier is a 5 so on this course students do not study the more complex content. In the foundation tier, students develop essential number and problem-solving skills that they will use on a daily basis in their future lives. The higher tier course challenges and stretches the students' mathematical understanding with higher level algebra and trigonometry. This course is the perfect preparation for A Level mathematics.

The IGCSE syllabus and course content

IGCSE mathematics covers the four key strands of mathematics – number, algebra, geometry, and statistics in detail. There is a focus on application and problem-solving questions throughout the four strands.

Assessment Details

Both tiers are assessed in the same manner. Students sit two written examinations at the end of Year 11. Each is worth 50% of the overall grade. Both papers allow the use of a calculator.

Careers

Achieving a grade 5 or higher in your GCSE mathematics is a prerequisite for many courses in Sixth Form and University. One of the top grades in mathematics can lead to high level jobs in finance, data analytics, engineering, education, management, and computer science. Highly qualified mathematicians are known for their ability to solve problems and their attention to detail; this ensures that they are a very sought-after commodity in the working world.

Pearson Edexcel Physical Education (1PE0)

Course Overview

Students will learn about the human body and how it works to aid sports performance. They will also learn about how to train to develop components of fitness to improve sports performance. Finally, they will also learn about health, conditions that can arise from a sedentary lifestyle, psychological aspects of performance, coaching methods and contemporary issues in sport. They will also participate in three sports practically and undertake a personal exercise programme.

It is highly recommended that students taking this qualification should take part in at least one sport from the exam board approved list (contact Mr Fitzpatrick for details) outside of school in order to achieve a higher grade in this subject.

Assessment Details

- Two externally marked exam papers.
- One written coursework piece about their personal exercise programme.
- Three sporting performances, assessed and filmed, which are both internally and externally marked and moderated.

Careers

This qualification gives an excellent grounding in the key foundations of sport and therefore is a good introduction to prepare students for further learning linked to any future profession in sport. This could include sports science and sports coaching.

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Pearson Edexcel International Double Award Science (4SD0)

Course Overview

Double Award Science is where students study all three sciences (biology, chemistry and physics) which ultimately lead to two IGCSEs based on their overall performance across all three science subjects. This is a wonderful opportunity for everyone to leave school with an excellent level of scientific literacy. You will build the skills to truly understand (and question) the world around you. This route would mean that you had the opportunity to pursue other options in KS4 should you want to. If you decide you want to follow science at KS5, that will be open to you if you meet the entry requirements. If you study Double Award Science and then decide you want to follow a career in medicine, engineering or any STEM subject for that matter, Double Award will not mean you have closed any doors! If anything, Double Award will allow you to have a broad and balanced curriculum at KS4 whilst also keeping all doors open for you at KS5.

Assessment Details

Double Award will be examined with one exam in each science (a total of three examinations).

Careers

You will develop so many skills that you will be able to go on and study anything with this qualification. Maybe you want to be a doctor, a geologist, an astrophysicist, a marine biologist or an ecologist. This qualification keeps all doors open!

Course Overview

The IGCSE First Language Spanish course is designed for learners whose first language is Spanish. The course enables learners to develop the ability to communicate clearly, accurately and effectively when speaking and writing, use a wide range of vocabulary, and the correct grammar, spelling and punctuation, and to develop a personal style and an awareness of the audience being addressed.

Learners are also encouraged to read widely, both for their own enjoyment and to further their awareness of the ways in which Spanish can be used. Cambridge IGCSE First Language Spanish also develops more general analysis and communication skills such as inference, and the ability to order facts and present opinions effectively.

Assessment Details

All candidates take four papers: Reading, Listening, Speaking and Writing. All students will be eligible for grades A* to G.

Cambridge IGCSE German Foreign Language (0525)

Course Overview

This course is designed for students who are learning German as a foreign language. The aim is to develop an ability to use the language effectively for practical communication. The course is based on the linked language skills of listening, reading, speaking and writing, and these are built on as learners progress through their studies.

The course also aims to offer insights into the culture of countries where German is spoken, thus encouraging positive attitudes towards language learning and towards speakers of other languages.

Assessment Details

All candidates take four papers: Reading, Listening, Speaking and Writing. All students will be eligible for grades A* to G.

Pearson Edexcel Drama (1DR0)



Course Overview

Over the course of two years students will develop skills in performance, devising original pieces of theatre as well as theatre appreciation. They will study play texts, learn about different theatre practitioners and the influence they have had over the development of performance styles and genres. Students will develop several cross curricular skills through their study, including communication, teamwork, presentation, problem solving, creativity, research and leadership.

The IGCSE syllabus and course content:

The course is split into 3 areas of study

- Devising, where students create their own original piece of drama and accompanying written portfolio.
- Performing, where students perform 2 extracts from a play.
- Theatre makers in practice, where students study 'An Inspector Calls' as well as reviewing live theatre.

Assessment Details

There are 3 elements to assessment:

Component 1: 40% of overall course. Students must submit a video of their final performance and accompanying portfolio, this is marked by the teacher and moderated by EdExcel.

Component 2: 20% of overall course. Students will perform their play extracts to an audience (which will be filmed) and must submit a short written explanation of their performance. This is sent off to be marked by an examiner.

Component 3: 40% of overall course. One written exam in 2 sections - 'An Inspector Calls' and live theatre review. Exam is 1 hour 45 and consists of short and long answer questions.


The IGCSE syllabus and course content:

There are a range of careers within theatre, including, but not limited to, performer, designer, stage manager, director, front of house and technician. Drama promotes the development of relevant transferable skills, useful in several areas of a student's academic life and beyond. Some professions that largely benefit from the skills built in drama include teaching, law, project management, first responders, hospitality, media and politics. According to a study of Russell Group universities, 100% of students who applied for a law degree at three of their universities who studied Drama and Theatre at A Level were successful in their application, which demonstrates the cross curricular value of the subject.

Pearson Edexcel Music (1DR0)



Course Overview

When studying GCSE music, students listen to, perform and compose music, encouraging aesthetic and emotional development, self-discipline and, importantly, creativity. As a result, they enhance their appreciation and enjoyment of music, an achievement that forms an ideal foundation for future study and enhances life-long musical enjoyment. They study music of all styles; each style is placed in its historical and cultural context, and they are encouraged to be perceptive, sensitive and critical when listening. Although the majority of the specification examines Western European music, the music of other cultures is always represented.

The IGCSE syllabus and course content:

Performance: Students will develop skills on their chosen instrument(s) and also practise playing as part of a group.

Composition: Students will learn to compose in different styles, both by following instructions given by the exam board and by developing their own ideas in a free composition.

Appraising: This is based on the study of eight fairly short set works. Students will also learn to appreciate an unfamiliar piece of music and practise writing down a simple melody which has been played several times.

Assessment Details

Performance and Composition are internally assessed and externally moderated: Performance (30%)

At least four minutes in all, of which one minute or more must be as part of a group.

Composing (30%)

Two compositions; one free choice and one to a brief set by the exam board. At least three minutes long in all

Appraising (40%)

One written exam (1 hour 45 minutes)

Music also opens doors to professions like medicine, law or accountancy because it is a highly regarded academic subject which complements other choices well.

Cambridge IGCSE Latin (0480)



Course Overview

We are delighted to be able to offer Latin this year as a GCSE option. You will learn the language and read some extracts from literary texts. It is a highly respected subject which has been appreciated by many for its intellectual challenge and its strong development of logical skills. It never fails to impress on application forms and in resumés! It has traditionally appealed in particular to those who enjoy other languages and Maths. You are only tested on reading the language and literary appreciation: all answers are in English and there are no speaking, listening or writing elements.

As it is a challenging subject to be taken in a two year course you should have either a prior knowledge of the language or be consistently achieving higher grades in Lengua Castellana (and Llengua Catalana if you take it - fluent knowledge of either makes learning Latin easier). Beginners would also be asked to attend preparation sessions during the summer term of Year 9.

Course Content

Language: the prescribed grammar from the Cambridge specification and a set word list (any word not on the list will be given in the examination). One translation from Latin into English and one comprehension, answered in English.

Literature: questions on two set texts, one by Virgil and one by Cicero.

Assessment Details

Two written examinations of 1 hour 30 minutes each: Language (50%) and Literature (50%)

The course is designed for learners with a near-native command of the language. The course develops learners' ability to communicate clearly, accurately and effectively. They learn how to employ a wide-ranging vocabulary, use correct grammar, spelling and punctuation, and develop a personal style and awareness of the audience being addressed. Learners are also encouraged to read widely, both for their own enjoyment and to develop an appreciation of how writers achieve their effects.

Assessment Details

All candidates will be evaluated on Reading, Listening, Speaking and Writing skills. All students will be eligible for grades EX (Excel·lent) to IN (Insuficient).

Careers

Catalan is an official language in the Balearic Islands and other Catalan speaking regions of Spain (Catalunya, Valencia). Catalan is required to access all state universities in the Catalan-speaking regions and is necessary to access employment opportunities in the public sector (health, politics, education, among others).
