EXPERIENTIAL/CLINICAL COMPONENT:

Experiential/Clinical Component Requirements - All students are required to complete 120 hours of hands-on experience in a full-service veterinary hospital or clinic. Students are required to document and upload hours each week and upload the skills list once completed. Once you complete this program you will be able to immediately start working with Career Services at MedCerts
