This role will lead FFCC's Land Use work programme, focused on the development and implementation of a national land use framework for England. With expert knowledge of land use, this postholder will be familiar with Action Research methodologies and will take a lead on conducting excellent research to support the work programme, writing clear and compelling reports and policy briefings, and facilitating action to implement the strategies and plans.

With outstanding project and people skills, the postholder will be able to work effectively with many diverse and authoritative stakeholders and partners to provide strategic coordinator of the programme and manage the delivery of the associated projects.

Key Tasks and Responsibilities

- Manage the Land Use work programme and associated research projects, assuring project delivery and output quality within planned project budgets and deadlines, and undertaking internal and external reporting.
- Undertake primary and secondary research, including qualitative and quantitative analysis with a range of data sources and stakeholder groups.
- Lead on the development of FFCC's work programme plans on Land Use, ensuring they contribute to the overall aims of the organisation.
- Work closely with partner organisations to build the case for a land use framework for the whole of England, providing research and analysis that will support the adoption of this recommendation by policy makers.
- Play a key role in the implementation of a Land Use framework in Devon, Cambridgeshire
 and other locations, and support the sharing of learning from different land use initiatives
 around the UK.
- Work with partners to align different data sets that can help to inform decisions on land use and ensure that data is made available to land use frameworks if appropriate.



- Create high quality, engaging content in the form of research reports, briefing notes, blogs, and other written outputs, and presenting analysis and recommendations for public and professional audiences as required.
- Build strong relationships and partnerships with a wide range of organisations and individuals, including policy, practice, funders, academic and business stakeholders, across the UK.
- Coordinate internal and external events, including online and in person meetings and seminars.
- Work with our Communications Team to develop communication plans and compelling public narratives for our work.
- Represent our work externally at conferences, media appearances and other events.
- Support the wider research team to deliver high quality research and ensuring the development of robust and engaging research outputs across the FFCC's programme of work.

- Able to bring intelligent analysis into complex issues, translating detailed technical data into straightforward language. Strong analytical skills, numerate and comfortable with quantitative and qualitative data analysis.
- Ability to communicate confidently in different settings, and to present written material in a clear, concise and engaging manner to a range of different audiences.
- Confident in your outlook, and able to generate confidence in other with rapport building, persuasion and interpersonal skills including ability to communicate confidently with external stakeholders at all levels of seniority.
- Organised and efficient, with a good work rate and ability to prioritise and multitask.
- Ability to think laterally and creatively.
- Ability to work autonomously, demonstrating initiative, self-direction and motivation, and as part of a virtual networked team.
