It is a complex and diverse area that constantly challenges me and enables me to use my skills to enhance the quality of life and wellbeing of the people I work with. I have experience of working with a range of neurological conditions including stroke, Multiple Sclerosis, Parkinson's Disease, Guillain-Barre, spinal cord injuries, brain injury and Motor Neurone Disease.

My clinical role involves specialist neurological assessment and treatment in relation to cognitive & perceptual issues, mood, sensory motor problems, visual problems, functional activities, driving, positioning and postural management, spasticity management, vocational rehab, social inclusion & fatigue management. I also provide leadership, training and clinical expertise to a team of therapists and rehabilitation assistants.

My style of work is client centric, with emphasis on building a therapeutic relationship to aid in identifying client needs, motivations and goals. I value working within an MDT and involving relatives/carers as this is the best way to enhance patient outcomes. Rehabilitation is best delivered via a 24-hour approach, therefore educating family members, carers, teaching self-management strategies and supporting community integrations are all tools I use to support the clients I work with. This way of working is essential in making long-lasting changes for clients.

I am a very empathic person and hold myself to very high working standards, advocating for the people I work with when necessary. From a personal point of view, I love nature and the outdoors. Most of my hobbies are centered around being outside, such a rock climbing, fell walking, mountain biking and paddle boarding. Spending time outdoors or in green space has massive benefits to everyday life, both physically and mentally and I like to support clients to regain this important connection in their own way.
