
"Ice and Fire Docs" is a creative documentary workshop for Estonian and Finnish filmmakers with international ambitions.

The creative director of the workshop is a well-known tutor Mikael Opstrup from Denmark. The second principal tutor is Jesper Osmund, an internationally renowned film editor and narrative consultant who has edited more than 100 documentaries.

KAROLIINA GRÖNDAHL

DIRECTOR

Karoliina Gröndahl (b. 1984) holds an MA in documentary film directing from the DocNomads Joint Masters program. Skilled in conveying emotions through the moving image, Karoliina shoots most of her films herself.

Karoliina's latest short documentary Every Tom, Dick and Urpo (orig. Ei nimi miestä pahenna) premiered in September 2023 at the Helsinki International Film Festival – Love & Anarchy where it received a New Wave award. The documentary feature Standing in My Power, part of Ice and Fire Docs workshop and DocPoint IMPACT training, will premiere in 2024.

Karoliina's first feature-length television documentary Sentenced for Life broadcast in 2016 by the Finnish Broadcasting Company Yle. Karoliina is a board member of the Finnish Documentary Guild and an alumna of IDFAcademy 2022.

KIRSI MATTILA

PRODUCER

Kirsi Mattila has a licentiate degree in theater science from the University of Helsinki. She began her career in documentary filmmaking as director and scriptwriter in 1994. Her latest film, Marzia, My Friend (2015), is a documentary feature set in Afghanistan and Finland. It won the Best Human Rights Feature award at its international premiere in Galway Film Fleadh, and has subsequently won five other awards.

Since 2010 Kirsi Mattila has also worked as Icebreakers' producer in charge of producing TV programs and radio series for Finnish Broadcasting Company YLE.

The first feature documentary she produced was Tiina Madisson's The Beloved Daughter (2020). Kirsi is currently producing Mohamed El Aboudi's documentary film The Last Chapter and Karoliina Gröndahl's documentary film Standing in My Power.

KAUPO KRUUSIAUK

DIRECTOR

Kaupo Kruusiauk has graduated from the Baltic Film and Media School with a bachelor's degree in film directing, and from the Estonian Academy of Music and Theatre with a master's degree in theatre and film directing. Kaupo Kruusiauk has directed several short films, one full-length feature film (Sandra saab tööd, 2021), and a few episodes of the project Estonian Stories for the Estonian Public Broadcasting (Murust, Teaduse nimel, Kütt).

In its documentaries, Kaupo Kruusiauk has been portraying a chess player Jaan Ehlvest (Mängija, 2008), an actor and musician Peeter Volkonski (Viimane vürst, 2018), and a musician and composer Maria Faust (Machina Faust, 2022).

Kaupo Kruusiauk's most acknowledged film is Machina Faust. The Estonian Association of Film Journalists named it the best Estonian movie of 2022. Concurrently it was selected as the best Estonian documentary in 2022 at the Estonian Film and Television Awards gala. Machina Faust has been selected for the programme of CPH:DOX, Krakow Film Festival, Baltic Film Days, and New York Baltic Film Festival.

Katre Ratassepp has worked in the field of marketing and communication for over 20 years. Katre Ratassepp has designed public relations campaigns for several music festivals and for musician solo projects, as well as for contemporary art exhibitions and feature and documentary films. In Flo Film Katre Ratassepp is currently responsible for the distribution and communication of documentaries Machina Faust (film about a musician and a composer Maria Faust, 2022), Anett (film about recently retired Estonian tennis player Anett Kontaveit, to be premiered 2024), and Coaching for Ordinary People (film about people hunting for happiness with the help of personal coach, to be premiered 2024/2025).

SHORT SYNOPSIS:

Totem is an infamous tank T34 that stands on a high stone pedestal on the Estonian bank of Narva river, a natural border between Estonia and Russia with the gun provocatively turned westward. As Estonian government orders the removal of the soviet relict, Russians gather to protect the tank and everything it symbolizes. Totem is a tense and a bit absurd film of humans, histories and the irresistible magnetism of steel power.

LOGLINE:

After spending 10 years filming the rise and fall of the ultranationalist movement founded by my old childhood pal, I need to have a final reckoning with him and his new friends.

SHORT SYNOPSIS:

An old friendship has offered the director a vantage point into extremist nationalism. In front of his eyes, Lauri's childhood friend Tuukka became a genuine fascist ideologue. Today it seems though that steam is running out of Tuukka's outrageous party-political effort, and the self-identified radical racists are going to find themselves in a dead end. After a years long



journey in the position of observatory filmmaker, Lauri feels the growing need to at last take initiative in his hands. He embarks a serious effort to get rid of toxic cynicism and nihilism in his friend Tuukka and his new pals. This confrontation opens a window for change. It's time for reckoning.

Lauri Autere is a Finnish documentarist, director of photography and environmental activist born in Rovaniemi, based in Helsinki. In his work he has been occupied with themes of societal change, polarization and ecological crisis. His documentary short The One Who Remembers More, which takes us to the long lost land of Sompio, has traveled the world from Tromsø to Murmansk and Palestine. The feature film 111 góðir dagar with Lauri's cinematography won the prize of best film in Faroe Islands 2021.

LOGLINE:

Polish family father and coal miner, Szczepan, is admired by everybody in his community. Now time is up, all coal mines in Europe will be closed, but is it possible to abolish the heroes?

SYNOPSIS:

Coal Miner Szczepan with his daughter and colleagues take us into the Polish mining region. As a little boy he decided to be a coal miner just like his father and grandfather did.

Everyday Szczepan goes to the dark underground with his friends. They share good and bad moments together like soldiers on the battlefield. Soon will be his last shift and after that his colleagues will tear down his clothes with knives and scissors, so he can't wear them anymore.



For Szczepan the world that was once admired and respected has been cracked. All coal mines will be closed in Europe.

Szczepan's daughter is very close to him. She is starting journalism studies in Krakow. It signifies a new phase for both her and her family – the cycles of growth and change. Does she have to protect her community's traditional values and her fathers profession in the new environment?

Tonteri graduated with a Master of Arts from Aalto University. Tonteri's first feature was "The Blackouts", co-directed by Jerem Tonteri. It was awarded with a Grand Prix at Emigra Film Festival Warsaw in 2019. Tonteri has dual Finnish and Polish citizenship and in her work she often considers the importance of transnationalism. Her documentary film project "Once we were heroes", has been selected to take part in a year long Ice and Fire Docs workshop and Baltic Sea Doc Forum 2023.


AINO HALONEN
