## Franki

Franki is full of energy, humor, and a deep commitment to preserving his community's traditions. He shares a playful yet profound bond with Emiliano, exchanging jokes but also discussing serious matters of heritage.

Recognizing the dangers facing his culture, Franki created the first drum school in Palenque. This act was revolutionary in a community where music has traditionally been learned through observation. He believes that, in today's world, distractions and modern influences threaten the continuity of their traditions. By formalizing music education, Franki hopes to ensure the survival of Palenquero musical heritage for future generations.





## Emiliano

Emiliano is a man of the land, speaking in a slow, poetic manner, steeped in rural wisdom. Though age has taken its toll, his spirit remains strong, especially when he talks about music and life in the countryside. He still dreams of returning to the mountains despite his physical limitations.

Deeply rooted in mystical beliefs, Emiliano speaks of plants with special powers and respects the "adelantados" or "zánganos"— healers and sorcerers who wield ancestral knowledge. He believes in the power of repeated phrases and prayers, viewing them as conduits to an invisible yet omnipresent force. To Emiliano, magic is interwoven with daily life, and rituals serve as a connection to the unseen world beyond.

Our film weaves together documentary narrative and visual poetry, drawing us into the spiritual realm of San Basilio de Palenque. Shot in black and white, its imagery transforms the ordinary into the sacred, portraying death not as an ending but as a journey and inheritance. Music, shadow, and reflection merge to unveil portals to the unseen and the quiet magic that lives within the everyday.
