

Eligible countries for IBF Classic



Please note that the director of the project should have the nationality of a country **as listed below** and should live and work in this country. In addition, the main producer attached to the project must be based in a country listed below.

Filmmakers originating from one of these countries and now living in diaspora can NOT apply for IBF Classic, but since 2019 they can apply for IBF Europe.

The country list below is based on the [DAC-list](#) but excludes the Eastern European countries that have access to funding from [the MEDIA programme](#). Filmmakers from the Caucasus can all apply: Georgia, Armenia and Azerbaijan (until the moment they'll have access to funding from the MEDIA programme).

In 2024, countries listed on the [2023 World Press Freedom Index](#) ranking from 108 to 180 (red and dark orange) are eligible. Some of these countries are not included in the DAC-list, but the situation concerning freedom of the press is difficult or very difficult. Only projects that address political or human rights related topics within the country itself will be accepted from these countries, see * marked below.

As of 2022, IDFA and the IDFA Bertha Fund will use the United Nations geoscheme. The United Nations geoscheme is a system which divides 249 countries and territories in the world into 6 regional, 17 subregional, and 9 sub-subregional groups. It was devised by the United Nations Statistics Division (UNSD) based on the [M49 coding classification](#).
