What Are Cookies

A cookie is a small text file which is stored by the user's browser. The cookie only contains data, not code, so it can't contain a virus or spyware. This doesn't mean that all cookies are harmless in intent, but they can only ever store information.

Cookies We Use

The website only uses one cookie which is the *craftsessionid* cookie. This is used to store general information about how the website is being used.

Cookies We Set

• Form related cookies

When you submit data through a form such as those found on contact pages or recruitment applications. Cookies may be set to remember your user details for future correspondence.
