<p>In this topic, the students will learn all about colours and how colours are used in art.</p> <p>Through creative projects, the students will identify different colours, and how colours mix to create new colours.</p> <p>They will relate colours to different environments, themselves, and emotions.</p>	<p>In this topic, the students will develop their language skills through learning to recite rhymes.</p> <p>The students will develop skills in sequencing, repeating refrains, and building vocabulary around common Nursery rhymes.</p> <p>Opportunities through cross-curricular activities will provide students with the ability to use new vocabulary and phrases in collaborative play.</p>	<p>In this topic, the students will learn about homes, why we have them, and how they are built.</p> <p>They will look at different homes and houses from around the world comparing cultures, looking at similarities and differences.</p> <p>Through this, the students will have the opportunity to explore celebrations that take place in families at home.</p>	<p>In this topic, the students will learn about the different dinosaurs, fish, and land animals, by classifying all of them into groups.</p> <p>They will create an animal world to learn about the environments they lived/live in to expand their knowledge.</p> <p>Throughout the topic, the students will build and expand their vocabulary through daily activities.</p>	<p>In this topic, the students will learn about the stories created by the world-renowned author.</p> <p>The focus will be on oral storytelling in groups and learning how stories are created using a variety of cross-curricular activities.</p> <p>The students will have the opportunity to build and develop mark-making skills.</p>	<p>In this topic, the students will learn about the world beyond earth and explore weather patterns.</p> <p>They will learn about the different planets, suns, moons, and stars, looking at their similarities and differences.</p> <p>The students will have the opportunity to explore environment through role-play, construction, and junk modelling.</p>	<p>In this topic, the students will learn about foods from around the world.</p> <p>Building on their prior knowledge from the topic 'Houses and Homes' the students will explore foods from different cultures.</p> <p>They will have the opportunity to create recipes and build cooking skills while developing their knowledge of healthy and unhealthy foods.</p>

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
