Why conduct a health check?

HMRC is increasing its focus on businesses that import and export goods to and from the UK. Where errors are found, HMRC is actively raising assessments for customs duty, import VAT, interest, and penalties. The expectation is that businesses take full responsibility for customs compliance, even when customs agents are used. There is no longer a "light touch" approach if HMRC identifies mistakes.

Proactively reviewing your customs processes, identifying issues, and disclosing them to HMRC, and taking steps to modify processes to reduce the chance of errors occurring can significantly reduce or even eliminate HMRC fines and penalties. A Customs Health Check is the essential first step to managing your customs duty risks effectively.
