We have high expectations of the young adults in this program. It is rewarding for us and can be life-changing for the teens to rise to the challenge. If you are wondering if your teen is ready for this program, please review the expectations below.

Zoo ALIVE teens are expected to:

- Communicate clearly and professionally in person, on the phone and via email
- Regularly check and read messages and updates on our Slack group, and email, and respond promptly to requests for information
- Use the Zoo's volunteer management system (CERVIS) to sign in and out when volunteering either using the app or logging in from a computer
- Read and follow all instructions for volunteering at events, including where to meet, how to set up, and what to do
- Arrive, depart and volunteer at the Zoo without adult supervision
- Understand and meet the needs of children in our programs, putting the children's needs before their own
- Provide exemplary customer service to Zoo visitors and program participants
- Supervise and lead children as they walk from place to place in the Zoo
- Exhibit appropriate social behaviors with other teens in the program, Zoo staff, our Zoo visitors and program participants
- Share their passion for animals and conservation with others
- Accept feedback as part of the learning process, and strive to improve their performance
- Volunteer and act in accordance with the values of the Zoo and our Youth Programs Unit
