

respond to the status and causes of the National Forest trail maintenance backlog. It would direct the Forest Service to develop strategies to more effectively use volunteers and partners to assist in maintaining national forest trails. Senate Bill 1110 is a companion bill to H.R. 845 which is currently in the House of Representatives. The bill was introduced at the request of Back Country Horsemen of America, Wilderness Society, and American Horse Council. [Read more...](#)

Poll: voters want federal funding for trails, walking, and biking

A recent poll found that four times as many voters favor increasing or maintaining current levels of federal investment in walking and biking paths. The Rails-to-Trails Conservancy sponsored a survey that found that support was strongest among Democrats, but an overwhelming majority of Republicans also supported the federal role in building infrastructure for biking and walking. The message that active transportation is affordable and produces a strong return on investment seems to resonate strongly with voters. [Read poll summary...](#) (pdf 1.5 mb)

National organizations support Transportation Alternatives

Support for the Transportation Alternatives Program is a key issue with the federal transportation authorizations expiring May 31. The Safe Routes to School National Partnership gathered quotes from 16 national organizations about why they support federal funding for bicycling and walking programs. A letter supporting Transportation Alternatives Program Improvement Act (Senate Bill 705) was signed by 42 organizations. Recreation Participation Report counts Americans outdoors

According to The Outdoor Foundation's 2014 Outdoor Recreation Participation Report, nearly 143 million Americans, or 49.2 percent of the US population, participated in an outdoor activity at least once in 2013. Intertwine Alliance and Portland-area wildlife refuges will manage new investment



The Rails-to-Trails Conservancy is requesting your help to communicate to USDOT Secretary Foxx the importance of making strategic reforms to administrative policies and practices during his tenure to prevent thousands of tragic fatalities and injuries. Portland's Tilikum Crossing "Bridge of the People" will be rail with trail bridge

A new bridge over the Willamette River will be the largest car-free transit bridge in the U.S., carrying light rail trains, buses, streetcars, cyclists, and pedestrians. Walkers and cyclists will have their own 14-foot wide lanes, but private cars and trucks will not be permitted. The 1,720-foot cabled-stayed bridge features colorful night lighting. Featured Recreational Trails Program-funded project: Potts Memorial Park

The City of Salisbury, Missouri used Recreational Trails Program funds to improve the trails in Potts Memorial Park. An important goal was making the trail more accessible to those with disabilities. Prior to the project, trails were typically only two and a half feet wide. The trail surface was also rough, with washouts in many areas. The trail now has a crushed rock surface that is packed nearly as hard as asphalt, allowing wheelchair users to easily maneuver the trail's course. [Read more and see photos...](#)

Featured National Recreation Trail: SC Revolutionary Rivers Water Trail

This 66-mile trail on scenic waterways offers a series of short excursions, overnight rustic camping opportunities, and reminders of the Revolutionary War. The route follows the scenic Lynches River through the cypress and tupelo swamplands frequented by Revolutionary War hero General Francis Marion. To guide paddlers, mile markers and directional signs are placed on wood duck nesting boxes along the river trail. [Read more and see photos...](#)

Israel's Gospel Trail: Nazareth to Capernaum

The Gospel Trail begins at Mount Precipice, on the southern outskirts of Nazareth, traveling through limestone hills and fertile valleys, past ancient towns and modern villages, to the site of ancient Capernaum,

on the shores of Lake Kinneret (the Sea of Galilee). The route incorporates established trails and pathways that have been traveled since ancient times by shepherds and farmers, merchants and pilgrims, armies, kings, and prophets. [Read more and see photos...](#) (pdf 1.1 mb)

Is the "world's most dangerous path" in Spain?

The Daily Mail reports on El Caminito del Rey, which was a popular challenge for adventurers until five people died on the path during 1999-2000. "But 14 years after it was closed due to safety fears, the famous walkway-known as the most dangerous in the world-is set to reopen to the public." The precarious walkway rises over 100 metres (328 ft) above the river below in a narrow gorge in the Spanish province of Malaga. [Read more and see photos...](#)
