

### NY budgets \$200 million to create Empire State Trail

New York's 2018 State Budget provides \$200 million to complete the Hudson River Valley Greenway and Erie Canalway trails and creates the Empire State Trail. The 750mile trail will provide new opportunities for hiking and biking along scenic vistas and through charming, historic communities, driving tourism and economic activity across New York. *Read more and see photos...*

### **Trail Maintenance Manual for volunteers**

The New York-New Jersey Trail Conference has published the 7th Edition of its "Trail

Maintenance Manual." It is intended to guide individual trail maintainers in their tasks: Patrolling the trail, Reporting trail conditions, Clearing obstructions and litter, Maintaining blazes, Protecting the trail, and Educating hikers about trail use and preservation. <u>Download 50-page manual (311 kb)...</u>

### Natural areas recreation management strategy

The City of Surrey, BC has a "Natural Areas: Access and Recreation Management Strategy." The scope of this strategy covers the management of natural areas that have been acquired for public use and benefit. #### Metropolitan Branch Trail (DC) safety and access study

This trail along the Metro line is a key connector in northeast Washington, DC. However, the trail faces challenges of perceptions of safety, limited access, and poor visibility. Besides addressing safety concerns, key goals are expanding access to extend the reach, impact, and use of the trail. *Download the 90-page study (pdf 9.3 mb)...* 

#### Best practices for trails crossings

Minnesota DOT produced "Best Practices Synthesis and Guidance in At-Grade Trail-Crossing Treatments." It provides guidance on safety treatment applications at trail crossings, which have frequently been the sites of bicycle, pedestrian, and snowmobile crashes. It includes principles of user-friendly trail-crossing designs and a toolbox of categorized treatments widely used in the U.S. *Download the 307-page study (pdf 3.2 mb)...*
