



The NPS Challenge Cost Share Program is celebrating the 50th anniversary of the National Trails and Wild & Scenic Rivers systems. Challenge Cost Share ("CCS") projects are intended to build collaboration between the National Park Service and project partners. For 2018, the program will provide \$386,000, to be matched 1-to-1 by non-federal funds and in-kind support. They anticipate supporting approximately 20 projects. *Read more...*
