Inquiry from New York State: "The NYS Office of Parks, Recreation & Historic Preservation (OPRHP) is developing a statewide, nonmotorized Greenways Plan in 2020. The plan will result in a roadmap for linking our up-and-coming Empire State Trail with existing regional and local trail corridors and planned or undeveloped sections. As part of the Plan we will be engaging the public through multiple avenues, including an online survey. Our office is seeking example surveys used for similar efforts in other states. In doing so, we hope to develop some questions that go beyond just use patterns and demographics, and better inform the needs and trends of current and potential trail users across our state."

In the greater New York metropolitan region, the New York-New Jersey Trail Conference is taking a leadership role in coordinating stewardship efforts to keep up with growing threats. There is no one answer to solving this issue; it is our belief that we can create better outdoor experiences through user education, public participation, and sustainable, on-the-ground solutions. The Trail Conference has joined with land managers and local partners to begin a multi-phased stewardship approach on the Appalachian Trail, at Breakneck Ridge, and in the Catskills.
