With no new National Recreation Trails (NRTs) designated in 2019, and the deadline for 2020 National Trails Day fast approaching, we are encouraging Secretary Bernhardt to uphold this Hawaiian Island Trail Bridge Re-Opens Trail to Remote Community



The 3-mile long Kalaupapa Trail is the only trail access point in and out of the remote community of Kalaupapa on the Hawaiian island of Molokai. When a landslide took out an old aluminum bridge, tradition of honoring and celebrating our nation's trails and designating new NRTs. 
