

## Information Needed From Presenters to Start Webinar Promotion

**Learning credits/CEUs:** In order to be eligible for learning credits/CEUs, webinars <u>must</u> run the length of 70-75 minutes. We allow 15 minutes of Q&A at the end (as well as a short intro from the webinar coordinator at the beginning), making our webinars an hour and a half (90 minutes) in total length.

American Trails is an approved provider for <u>American Planning Association (APA)</u> and can offer Certification Maintenance (CM) credits (1.5 CM credits), as well as an LA CES approved provider for the <u>American Society of</u> <u>Landscape Architects (ASLA)</u> (1.5 PDH). American Trails webinars are also eligible for CEU equivalency petition for park professionals with the <u>National Recreation and Park Association (NRPA)(</u>0.10 CEU credits). In order for webinars to qualify for these credits, attendees interested in receiving any of these credits must take an evaluation survey as well as a 12 question quiz following the webinar. American Trails will follow up with presenters with more details on during premeetings once your webinar is approved.

5. Webinars quality for HSW courses as those in which at least seventy-five (75) percent of the subject matter applies the principles of mathematical, physical, and social sciences in consultation, evaluation, planning, design (including, but not limited to the preparation and filing of plans, drawings, specifications, and other contract documents), and administration of contracts relative to projects principally directed at the functional and aesthetic use and preservation of land. These subjects may include, but are not limited to the following list (many topics fall into webinars that American Trails has hosted).
