



IMPACT STATS (2018 Survey)



- 92% indicated OSI trainings offered skills they needed for required work
- 61% of trainees want to take more OSI training
- 84% have used their training in the last 2 to 3 years
- Average volunteers lead by OSI trainees is 30 people annually





- Diversity of volunteers


Specific Project related metrics/on the ground accomplishments

- Miles of trails maintained/closed/restores
- Native vegetation planted

Project Costs

- Staff time
- Food
- Tools, equipment
- Training
