Overview

Through funds provided by generous sponsors and partners, American Trails is proud to offer up to 16 scholarships for the Hulet Hornbeck Emerging Leaders Scholarship Program to young adults between the ages of 21-28 to attend the **24th International Trails Symposium (ITS) and Training Institute** to be held in Syracuse, New York April 28 to May 1, 2019. In addition to attending ITS, scholarship recipients will:

- Engage in discussions with career advisors
- Network with Symposium participants
- Deliver a professional group presentation on your ITS experience in a dedicated concurrent session
- Work together on a Professional TrailBuilders Association (PTBA) trail service project
- Enjoy a field day highlighting trail issues and opportunities

The Hulet Hornbeck Emerging Leaders Scholarship Program will provide unique training and mentoring opportunities to inspire young adults to choose a career path so they can leave a lasting legacy on the world. Scholarship candidates should be young adults who have an interest in trails, conservation, and/or outdoor recreation and are interested in learning about these as potential career paths.

Diversity and inclusivity are important to us so that we can meet everyone's deepest needs, values, and long-term interests. We welcome individuals of all backgrounds to apply regardless of past trails experience. We are more interested in potential.

Scholarship funds will cover the cost of ITS registration, airfare, Syracuse ground transportation, lodging, and meals. Scholarship recipients will be asked to pay a non-refundable deposit of \$100 (the full cost is \$2,500), except in cases in which the need to have the \$100 fee waived is demonstrated. The \$100 fee will go towards the scholarship.

Scholarship recipients are expected to participate fully in the Symposium and all scheduled group activities, including a group dinner and orientation prior to the Symposium (April 27). Recipients must arrive no later than the morning/afternoon on April 27 and stay through the duration of the conference (departing on May 2).

Eligibility Requirements:

- 21-28 years of age at the time of the Symposium (April 28 to May 1, 2019)
- High school diploma or GED
- Interest in career paths related to trails, conservation, and/or outdoor recreation
- Demonstrate drive, maturity, and leadership potential
- Availability to participate in a phone/video interview

Timeline:

- Scholarship application deadline is October 15, 2018
- Phone/video interviews with top 20 scholarship applicants in November
- Notifications of scholarships winners is December 15, 2018


