The goal of the program is to provide direct funding to Forest Service partner organizations in support of projects that restore, protect, and maintain watersheds on our national forests and grasslands.

Here are some highlights:

65 Projects

38 in 2023 and 27 in 2024. Current projects are **returning over 400% greater match** than was proposed in their applications. This results in...

8:1 Match

For every dollar committed to this program, partner awardees are returning 8 dollars in cash and in-kind match.

The Legacy Trails Program is a grant program targeted at high-performing partner organizations leading projects that serve all user types including motorized and nonmotorized trails. It is administered by American Trails, overseen by a diverse coalition of nonprofit partners, and funded through a cost-share agreement with the Forest Service.
