- Campsites every 15 miles or less




### **Empire State Water Trail**

To complement the Governor's Empire State Trail, a sister water trail will be developed, linking over 1,700 miles of navigable State waterways together with consistent branding and website development.

## **Empire State Water Trail**

- The New York State Department of Environmental Conservation has been managing New York's first water trail, the **Adirondack Canoe Routes** (600+ miles), since the late 1800's.
- New York currently has, 1,700+ miles of **operational, interconnected** water trails.
- These water trails are operated by a mixture of governmental and non-governmental entities.
- New York is home to two of the first nine National Water Trails designated by the U.S. Department of Interior, the Hudson River Greenway Water Trail (256 miles) and the Bronx River Water Trail (8 miles).





NATIONAL WATER TRAILS SYSTEM



A distinctive national network of exemplary water trails which are designated by the Secretary of the Interior. The trails within the National Water Trails System are cooperatively supported and sustained.



# **A National Water Trail is:**

- Exemplary
- Designated by the Secretary of the Interior (or Secretary of Agriculture)
- Recognized as part of the National Trails System
- Managed by a local management entity
- Currently 21 NWTs

# **Empire State Water Trail**

#### New York's Water Trails:

- The Lake Champlain Paddlers' Trail (120 miles) a member supported water trail from Whitehall to the Canadian border in New York and Vermont
- The NYS Canal System (450 miles) consisting of the Erie, Champlain, Oswego and Cayuga-Seneca Canals
- The New York City Water Trail (160 miles) including the Bronx River Water Trail
- South Shore Blueway on Long Island (18 miles)
- The Bronx River Water Trail (8 miles)
- Hudson River Greenway Water Trail (256 miles) from Whitehall to Manhattan
- The Northern Forest Canoe Trail (147 miles in New York/743 miles total) runs from Old Forge in the Adirondacks through Quebec, Vermont, and New Hampshire, ending in Maine
- The Delaware River Water Trail (75 miles in New York) running from Hancock, NY to Trenton, NJ



## **Economic & Health Benefits of Water Trails**

- <u>Economic Benefits</u>: Maine Island Trail \$2.1 million/year (2011), eastern North Carolina \$103.9 million/year (2002), in New York City over 285,000 participated in the Downtown Boathouse's free kayaking program (1995-2012).
- <u>Paddler Spending</u>: 2010 Great Hudson River Paddlers spent a minimum of \$135/day/person, not including that spent on hotels/restaurants the night before launch or in communities along the way.
- <u>Business's Supported</u>: On the HRGWT there are at least 13 outfitters making a living as a result of guiding on and/or making retail sales to users of the Hudson River. At least 20 other outdoor recreation based businesses in three states draw customers from human powered boaters on the Hudson River Greenway Water Trail.
- <u>Health Benefits:</u> Weight loss, stress relief, strength gain, improved confidence from learning new skills, injury rehabilitation.



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# Water Trail Economic Benefits

- Studies: Paddlers spent \$27-\$63/ day
  - From: Case Studies of Water Trail Impacts on Rural Communities, Lindsy Johnson, University of Oregon 2002
  - Food, lodging, gas, retail, recreational services
- Job creation
  - NFCT: \$12M and 280 jobs (740-mi trail in 5 states)
- States: A recreation & tourism strategy
  - Fla, Iowa, NC, Ohio, Ore, Penn, Wisc
- Economic development tool, not a solution 2

- Note the natural & manmade local conditions that can be hazardous—wind & waves, lightning, heat, cold, marina and shipping traffic, locally odd currents


