SURVEY METHODOLOGY


- Based on Rails-to-Trails Conservancy's Trail User Survey Workbook
- All surveys use primarily the same questions with some local customization
- Forms are available at trailheads and trailside businesses
- Sample is self-selecting
- Form is a self-mailer or deposited in a drop box at the trailhead
- Completed survey forms are tabulated in a Microsoft Excel spreadsheet





PINE CREEK RAIL TRAIL





- 60 mile trail between Jersey Shore and Wellsboro, PA
- Rural recreational area fishing, hunting, hiking, boating
- Largest communities
 - Jersey Shore 4,482
 - Waterville 468 (estimated)
 - Wellsboro 3,328
- Trail managed by PA
 Department of Conservation and Natural Resources
- 1,049 user surveys were completed between the end of March and the end of October, 2006

HERITAGE RAIL TRAIL

- 21 mile trail between York, PA and Maryland state line
- Connects to additional 20 mile trail in Maryland (Northern Central Rail Trail)
- Urban, suburban, rural environment
- Largest Communities
 - City of York 40,862
 - Glen Rock Borough 1,809
 - New Freedom Borough 3,512
- Managed by the York County Department of Parks and Recreation
- Surveys conducted in 1999, 2001, 2004 and 2007






PERKIOMEN RAIL TRAIL






- 19 mile trail between Green Lane Borough and Oaks, PA
- Rural, suburban environment
- Largest Communities
 - Green Lane Borough 584
 - Schwenksville Boro. 1,693
 - Collegeville Boro. 8,032
- Trail managed by Montgomery County Department of Parks and Heritage Services
- Results based on 445 completed surveys through September 2008






HOW OLD ARE THEY

Economic Impact


- Trail users purchase "hard goods" (bicycles, running shoes, cross country skies)
- Trail users purchase "soft goods" (water, ice cream, sandwiches) in conjunction with each trail visit
- Trail users from distant locations stay overnight in local accommodations
- New business formations or revitalization of existing businesses can be directly correlated with the trail usage
















