Personal Protective Equipment

Students are expected to provide their own Personal Protective Equipment. Below is a list of required Personal Protective Equipment (PPE). Occupational Safety and Health laws require these personal protective equipment items

- Hard Hat
- Safety Glasses
- Hearing Protection
- Leather-palmed work gloves
- Rubber coated fabric work gloves (optional)
- Long sleeved work-shirt
- Long pants
- Sturdy leather boots
- Wet/Cold weather clothing (as needed)

Tools and Equipment

Tools for the class will be provided, however, if there are specific items from your organization's cache that you have questions on, or would like practice with, feel free to bring them and we will try to integrate them into the course. This can be beneficial for familiarizing yourself with your own gear, inspecting your own gear, and for the entire group to see different equipment types and styles. Please clearly label any equipment that you bring to the training.
