What Is Apple Business Manager (ABM)



ABM is an easy web based portal for IT administrators to automate device deployment, purchase and distribute content and manage roles in an organisation.



ABM has combined to provide a unified platform for what was formerly known as DEP (Device Enrollment Programme) and VPP (Volume Purchase Programme) for bulk and zero-touch deployment.



Working together with a Mobile Device Management (MDM) solution, ABM allows the enrolment of devices easily, the ability to deploy content and delegate administrative privileges.



The Device Enrolment Programme (DEP) and Volume Purchase Programme (VPP) are now integrated in to ABM, so IT can bring together everything needed to deploy iOS devices, MAC and Apple TV.

Three Key Areas Of Benefits:

Devices

- Automatically enrol devices in MDM for easy start up
- Speed up the set-up process by removing steps in Setup Assistant
- Manage easily, default MDM servers by setting a default server by device type

Content

- Purchase and distribute apps in bulk and via MDM & manage licences for users
- Control the entire distribution process
- Distribute apps to devices or users in any country

Roles

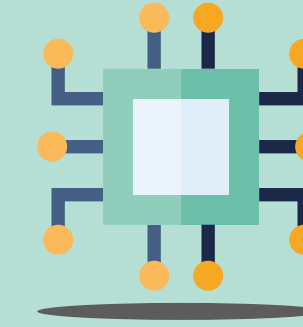
- Companies can create Apple IDs for IT staff to manage device enrolment and content purchasing within ABM

- Easily deactivate and delete user accounts

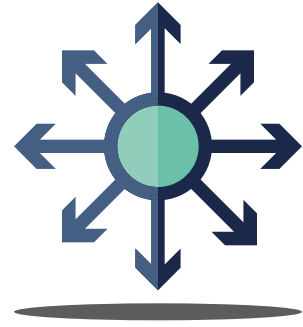

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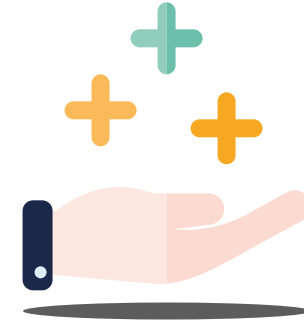

Need To Know:

To deploy with ABM, IT admins initially need: Devices bought from Apple Authorised Reseller, an ABM Account & DUNS Number and an MDM solution that supports Apple Business Manager, like MaaS360.

Apple Business Manager requires a supported browser (Safari in iOS 12 or later or iPad OS 13.1 on iPad, Safari 9 or later on macOS, Google Chrome 35.0 or later Microsoft Edge on Windows), an initial account and verification contact, and details about your organisation.

DEP reached end of life in December 2019, so ensure any customers will need to upgrade to Apple Business Manager if they have a DEP account.

Apple Business Manager itself is free to use. However other costs, such as device costs, subscription costs for the MDM solution and perhaps the membership costs for the Apple Developer Program (if you are looking to distribute custom apps to businesses in Apple Business Manager) will need to be considered.
