Agriculture Policy of a global champion - reading materials

Dialogue 1. International trade: A future proof agri-food trade policy

As part of its role to facilitate stakeholder's engagement with Dutch policy processes, the Netherlands Food Partnership (NFP) hosts a consultative dialogue around the new international policy directions of the Ministry of Agriculture, Nature and Food Quality (MinLNV). This is part of a series of three independent and informal network dialogues under the name "Agricultural policy of a global champion".

The first dialogue is about the Dutch role within international trade for the development of robust local food markets in LMICs, which are supportive of the inclusiveness and sustainability of the food system. The following resources help to identify contextual information and interesting interventions that show what has been done in practice.
