



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

GRACIE ANDERSON

Gracie just wrapped up two years touring with the Broadway National tour of CATS as a Dance Captain and Swing. She grew up training and competing in Latin, Standard and Smooth ballroom styles all around the world. She is honored to be a 13x top six finalist at NDCA's U.S. Nationals in the Latin and Standard championships. As a two-time national champion, she represented the U.S. at the WDC World Championships in Paris, France placing 14th in Youth Latin and 8th in the Fred Astaire Cup. She went on to graduate from Marymount Manhattan College as the Gold Key recipient for her BFA in Dance, concentrating in ballet. While at MMC, she performed works by Robert Battle, Gerald Arpino, Jessica Lang, Jessica Hendricks and Gabrielle Lamb and was accepted to The School at Jacob's Pillow's Contemporary program. Gracie can be seen on FOX TV series: Sons of Tucson as a principle dancer and was a dancer in Royal Family's production, "Women on Fire". You can find her teaching guest classes at Steps on Broadway or touring as a faculty demonstrator, guest teacher and judge with the NYCDA convention.



JC SCHUSTER

JC was born and raised in Dallas ,TX, is an entertainer and choreographer with over 19 years of experience in the entertainment industry. His career started at the age of 14 while touring nationally and internationally with the show, "Tap Kids". Some of his film and television credits include Fosse/Verdon (FX), Annie (2014), HBO's Vinyl, Glee, Gossip Girl and Nurse Jackie. While living in NY, his professional career extended to both Off and On Broadway, including the original Broadway company of The SpongeBob SquarePants Musical. His other Broadway credits include Fiddler on the Roof, Soul Doctor, and A.R.T's Finding Neverland. In addition, JC has had opportunities to work for Madonna, Keith Urban, Good Morning America, The Tonight Show with Jimmy Fallon, The Today Show, The View, The 72nd Tony Awards and the 90th annual Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade, to name a few. JC has expanded his experience in the entertainment business as a choreographer and assistant choreographer for TV, industrials, conventions, and conferences/events. He has had the privilege to work on shows for CHI Farouk Systems, The Yellow Conference, Orange County School Of The Arts and Pace University. For TV, JC was one of the choreographers for Orange Is the New Black and worked on the preproduction and production of the Emmy Award-Winning TV show as a choreographer's assistant and performer for Fosse/Verdon on FX.



Originally from Naperville Illinois, Abby began her dance training at the age of 5. She graduated from Marymount Manhattan College in 2020 with a BFA in Dance and was presented with the Gold Key honor for the Jazz concentration. She has performed original works and renowned pieces by Robert Battle, Jenn Freeman, Gabrielle Lamb, Jacqulyn Buglisi, Trey McIntyre, Michael Waldrop, and others. She has performed in events at The Joyce Theater, Jazz! At Lincoln Center, Sony Hall, and at The Auditorium Theater in Chicago where she was a part of the annual Dance For Life event. Abby danced with CoreDance Contemporary for their 2021-22 season and has been working on multiple video short film projects to be released in late 2022-23.

TWO NATIONALS - TWO COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIP AUDITIONS!



Get ready for an unforgettable summer filled with incredible talent, competition, and the chance to take your dancing to the next level. Stay tuned for more details, and we can't wait to see you there!

2-DAY READY, SET, DANCE!

Ready, Set, Dance! Has always been our way of introducing your youngest dancers to the inspiration and community of the convention world. This year we are excited to announce that Ready, Set, Dance! will be two half days concluding with a live performance on the main stage!

TEACHERS

We would not be here without your students! To show our appreciation, teachers can register at no charge for regional cities! In select cities we will be offering teacher classes and a teachers lounge, where you can reset and recharge.



AUDITIONING @ NYCDA

- The NYCDA audition process is designed to be supportive and educational a great place to learn! Expect some informal discussion about approaching a professional audition.
- Dancers should wear their assigned numbers in EVERY class both Saturday and Sunday.
- For best visibility, place ONE number on the UPPER body above the heart. Extra numbers are included. Additional numbers can be requested at the Registration desk.
- Attendance is important in all workshop classes. The Faculty are observing the entire weekend.
- The audition consists of combinations taught as part of the NYCDA workshop.
- Audition class is only open to auditioning dancers and registered teachers. No parent observers.
- Finalists will be selected in each age division numbers will be announced (no names).

SENIORS (ages 16-19) and TEENS (ages 13-15)

- The Senior/Teen Audition Class is Saturday in the Teen Room.
- All dancers will perform BOTH a ballet and jazz combination. No one is eliminated until finalists are announced.
- Senior and Teen Scholarship Winners and Runners-Up will be announced at the end of the Convention Finale.

JUNIORS (ages 11-12) and MINIS (ages 7-10)

- During the Sunday morning Jazz classes, in both the Junior and Mini Rooms, a casual, preliminary audition is held and finalists are chosen.
- Mini finalists join Junior finalists in the Junior room at 10:30am Sunday (beginning of lunch) for the Finalist Audition consisting of ballet and jazz.
- A special class for the Mini/Junior non-finalists is available in the Mini Room, while finalists are auditioning in the Junior Room.
- Junior and Mini Scholarship Winners and Runners-Up will be announced at the end of the Finale.

IMPORTANT NOTES:

- Dancers must be registered for the entire two-day workshop (age as of January 1, 2025)
- Once you have won as either a Regional Outstanding Dancer or Runner-Up for the 2024-2025 Regional Season, you may continue to audition for other special scholarships in another city, but may not re-audition for Outstanding Dancer.
- Independent Dancers will be considered for Regional Convention Scholarships, sponsorship scholarships, and special awards. Independent Dancers are NOT eligible to audition for Outstanding Dancer Scholarships.


All entries awarded Platinum, High Gold, Gold, High Silver, and Silver qualify for the NYCDA 2025 National Season Finale!

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

Joe is most passionate about his work as the Executive Director of the NYC DANCE ALLIANCE. He enjoys traveling the country, nurturing future generations of dancers and discovering new talent. He is always cultivating new projects, often utilizing the talents of his NYCDA dancers. In 2010, Joe Lanteri founded the NYC DANCE ALLIANCE FOUNDATION, as a vehicle to invest in gifted teenagers hoping to pursue their education and their love of the performing arts. Joe is also the Executive Director of ONSTAGE NEW YORK, offering another talent showcase opportunity for young performers.

In 2018, Joe became the co-owner and Executive Director of **STEPS ON BROADWAY**, New York City's premiere professional training center. *Dance Teacher* magazine featured Joe as the cover story of their May 2019 issue. Joe also serves as the Executive Producer and Director of the *Chita Rivera Awards*, the only annual awards that exclusively recognize dance excellence on Broadway and film. For over a decade, Joe directed *The Fred & Adele Astaire Awards*. Joe's dynamic style and explosive choreography have established him as a driving force in the shaping of New York City jazz dance style. He has served on the faculty of many international arts centers - Mexico, Japan, Italy and Denmark. In New York City, Joe has been an established jazz teacher at Steps on Broadway for decades and served on the prestigious faculty of The Juilliard School for 27 years.



SUZITAYLOR is an internationally recognized master teacher and choreographer and has been training professional and aspiring young dancers for the past 30 years. He appeared in Twyla Tharp's Broadway production Movin' Out, and had his singing debut in Burt Bacharach's and Hal David's The Look Of Love, choreographed by Ann Reinking and Scott Ellis.

Richardson has appeared on celebrated stages across the world, namely The Metropolitan Opera, The Kennedy Center, Paris Opera, The Bolshoi Theatre, The Mariinsky Theatre, The State Kremlin Palace, Teatro Massimo, and Teatro alla Scala. He has been a member and invited guest of prestigious companies including Alvin Ailey American Dance Theater, Frankfurt Ballet, Royal Swedish Opera Ballet, American Ballet Theatre, Washington Ballet, and San Francisco Ballet, to name a few.

Richardson, a Young Arts Finalist and Presidential Scholar, has received numerous awards including the Dance Magazine Award, Capezio Award, Ailey Apex Award, L.A. Ovation Award, Bessie Award, YoungArts Alumni Award, and most recently the Roosevelt "Rosey" Thompson Award presented by the Presidential Scholars Foundation. In the spring of 2109, Richardson received an honorary doctorate degree from The University of North Carolina School of the Arts in recognition of his extensive contributions to the field of dance.

Richardson has been a celebrity guest performer and choreographer for productions across media such as the American Music Awards, the Academy Awards, City Center's Encores! series, Italy's AMICI, and international franchises of So You Think You Can Dance. Richardson has been featured by famed artists such as Michael Jackson, Prince, Madonna, Elton John, and Aretha Franklin, and he appears in celebrated films such as the Oscar-Award winning Chicago, Julie Taymor's Across the Universe, and the recent independent film, Fall to Rise. He has worked with fashion icon, Tom Ford, Chic's Nile Rodgers, and recently contributed to Grammy-Award winning Jill Scott's video Back Together, which features dancers from COMPLEXIONS.

Internationally and domestically, he is a master teacher for dance programs such as the New York's All Stars Project, YoungArts Miami, United Way, and New York City Dance Alliance. 

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
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
