Campus Health Clinic: FHCMEC@OCU



Recently, the university began a partnership with the **Family HealthCare and Minor Emergency Clinic** (**FHCMEC**) to provide healthcare to the campus community. FHCMEC is staffed by a team of medical professional dedicated to providing quality healthcare services to the campus community including a range of primary and acute care services.

- Where is it? FHCMEC@OCU is located in the west wing of Kramer School of Nursing West. Additionally, you may visit FHCMEC off-campus locations at 11109 Surrey Hills Boulevard in Yukon or 6102 NW 63rd, Ste B in Oklahoma City. Visit the <u>FHCMEC website</u> for more location and contact information.
- What are the clinic's hours? The clinic is open from 8.30am to 5pm, Monday through Friday. In most cases, same day appointments are available. Call the clinic at 373.2400 with questions and/or to make an appointment.
- Who can go to the clinic? OCU employees and their dependents may visit the clinic. Employees and their dependents covered by the university's medical plans pay no out-of-pocket costs for clinic visits and services. Employees who are not on the university's medical plan may contact the clinic to determine if their insurance plan is accepted. The clinic accepts most major insurance carriers.
- What can the clinic do? The clinic is designed to provide acute and primary care services and may include lab work, screenings, imagining, and other services. Common acute care visits may include:
- ✓ Colds & allergies
- ✓ Cough
- ✓ Earache
- ✓ Eye irritation & redness

- Nausea, vomiting, diarrhea
- ✓ Routine immunizations
- ✓ Sinusitis
- ✓ Skin rashes & infections

- ✓ Fever or flu
- ✓ Headache
- ✓ Minor sprains & strains
- ✓ Minor burns & cuts

- ✓ Suture removal
- ✓ Throat soreness
- ✓ Travel medicine consultations
- ✓ Urinary tract infections

Common primary care services may include routine exams and wellness exams, disease prevention services and counseling, diagnosing, evaluating and treating common symptoms, managing common medical conditions, referrals to other providers for more specialized care, coordinating health services, and more.

• What's the employee medical plan clinic benefit? OCU employees and

their dependents covered by the university's medical plan can go to the clinic for services at OCU or at another FHCMEC location. Copays, deductibles, and coinsurance amounts are waived for OCU medical plan members and their covered dependents. Plan members will receive an EOB from BCBS with a patient responsibility of \$0.
