Here are some simple rules for this community:

- 1) Treat everyone with respect. Please report any spam, inappropriate or offensive comments.
- 2) To help keep the community a welcoming place for all, please refrain from sending direct messages to other community members unless you have permission to do so from that member. Before you DM someone (including Wiseup Experts), please ask their permission in a public channel.
- 3) Please use the right channels, e.g. if you have a question about your career, use #career-chat instead of #business-chat. This keeps Slack organised and makes it easier for people to consume and contribute. Along these same lines, do not post the same thing in multiple channels.
- 4) Use threads (replies)! Threads make it easy to follow conversations and prevent channels from getting messy.
- 5) When posting a question make sure it is written well. A good question is specific and comes with plenty of context. The more effort you put into your question, the better the answers will be.
- 6) Please do not post personal information that you would not be comfortable sharing with others in public channels.
- 7) Respect that other people in the community have had different life experiences and may have a different perspective to yours. We welcome different viewpoints.
