Genesis 6, 9, 2 Peter 3, Revelation 21 Small Group Plan

— Genesis 1:31 —

God saw all that he had made, and it was very good. And there was evening, and there was morning the sixth day.

OPEN IT / INTRODUCE IT ...

- What did God see in creation that was "very good?" Remember, this is before the creation of humanity.
- How was the creation of man and woman the crown of his creation?
- What was God's intention for humanity? What was the original garden plan??

LOOK AT IT / STUDY IT ...

— PURIFIED OR ANNIHILATED —

Genesis 6:13

So God said to Noah, "I am going to put an end to all **people**, for the **earth** is filled with violence because of them. I am surely going to destroy both them and the earth.

- How had the violence of <u>the people</u> filled <u>the earth</u> with violence?
- Did God really put an end to all people? Explain the wording in the text.
- What is God actually threatening?

Genesis 9:8-11

⁸ Then God said to Noah and to his sons with him: ⁹ "I now establish my covenant with you and with your descendants after you ¹⁰ and with every living creature that was with you — the birds, the livestock and all the wild animals, all those that came out of the ark with you — every living creature on earth. ¹¹ I establish my covenant with you: Never again will all life be destroyed by the waters of a flood; never again will there be a flood to destroy the earth."

- What is God actually promising (and not promising)?
- If the flood was used "to destroy the earth" and yet the earth remained, how should we define the word "destroy?"
- What is the difference between **purifying** and **annihilating**?
- Why would God want to cleanse rather than eliminate?

— REBOOTED OR DEMOLISHED —

2 Peter 3:6-7

- ⁶ By these waters also the world of that time was deluged and <u>destroyed</u>. ⁷ By the same word the present heavens and earth are reserved for fire, being kept for the day of judgment and <u>destruction</u> of ungodly men.
- How does Peter compare Noah's time (v. 6) and the end of time (v. 7)?
- The term "destruction" is used twice. How does the destruction in Noah's time inform our understanding of the destruction at the end of time?

— NEW-EARTH OR NON-EARTH —

Revelation 21:2-4

- ² I saw the Holy City, the New Jerusalem, coming down out of heaven from God, prepared as a bride beautifully dressed for her husband. ³ And I heard a loud voice from the throne saying, "Now the dwelling of God is <u>with men</u>, and he will live <u>with them</u>. They will be his people, and God himself will be <u>with them</u> and be their God. ⁴ He will wipe every tear from their eyes. There will be no more death or mourning or crying or pain, for the old order of things has passed away."
- The New Jerusalem "coming down" (v. 2) is explained three times as God living and being "with men" (v. 3).
- What would have to happen for God to come "down" and live "with" us?

USE IT / APPLY IT ...

- The Garden of Eden was here on planet earth. Adam and Eve walked with God in the garden and enjoyed the relationship.
- Imagine aloud what the garden would look like, how it would smell and sound, how the animals would live and move, and what a daily relationship with God would be like.
- How does God's plan for the garden help us understand His plan for heaven?
- Close by thanking God for remaining patient and true to us, even while we have been arrogant and stubborn. Praise Him for His amazing grace and mercy.
