



Funding Timeline



HUD ALLOCATES FUNDING BASED ON DAMAGE

The U.S. Dept. of Housing and Urban Development allocates \$117.9M in funding to the state of Louisiana for recovery needs associated with Hurricane Francine and publishes

Universal Notice for CDBG funds.

JAN 7, 2025

STATE DEVELOPS ACTION PLAN

Spending intentions and potential programs are derived from FEMA analysis of loss/damage statewide.

The development of the action plan included a series of consultation meetings to confirm disaster recovery unmet needs priorities.

JAN-MARCH 2025



JAN 16, 2025

HUD PUBLISHES FRN

HUD publishes Federal Register Notice, providing guidance for how the state must spend allocated funding.

MARCH 5, 2025

PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD ON ACTION PLAN BEGINS

The public comment period for the proposed action plan will be open for 30 days – ends April 4, 2025.

STATE SUBMITS ACTION PLAN

The state intends to submit final action plan to HUD for approval.

EARLY APRIL 2025

HUD APPROVAL OF ACTION PLAN

HUD has 45 days to review and respond.

MAY 2025

JUNE/JULY 2025 (anticipated)

HURRICANE FRANCINE PROGRAM LAUNCH

The state will directly contact homeowners based on FEMA IA to complete the Restore Louisiana Homeowner Assistance Program survey during this time period.

HUD-Defined Funding Criteria



HUD requires that at least 70% of all funding must be provided to homeowners at or below 80% of the Area Median Income.

LMI CATEGORIES

Very Low Income

to 30% of the area median income, as determined by HUD, adjusted for family size.

Low Income

Household's annual income is more than 30% and up to 50% of the area median income, as determined by HUD, adjusted for family size.

Moderate Income

Household's annual income is more than 50% and up to 80% of the area median income, as determined by HUD, adjusted for family size.

Restore Homeowner Assistance Program



BASIC ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS:

- Must have been the owner-occupant at time of the disaster event
- The damaged address must have been the homeowner's primary residence at the time of the disaster event
- The damage suffered must be a result of Hurricane Francine
- The structure must be eligible as determined by the program, which includes single family homes, duplexes, mobile homes, and condominiums
- The structure must be in one of the disaster-declared parishes
- Must have applied for FEMA Individual Assistance following the disaster, and FEMA's damage assessment must indicate that the damage to home is major/severe

Restore Louisiana Homeowner Assistance Program Objectives



Provide grant assistance to vulnerable low-to-moderate income (LMI) homeowners impacted by Hurricane Francine who occupied their home at the time of the disaster, received FEMA-determined major/severe damage and have the greatest unmet needs.

MAJOR/SEVERE AS DEFINED BY HUD

Major/severe damage is determined when at least one of the following criteria is met:

- FEMA inspected residential damage of \$8,000 or greater
- FEMA inspected personal property damage of \$3,500 or greater
- At least one foot of flooding on the first floor

Restore Louisiana Homeowner Assistance Funding Solutions



Solution 1 PROGRAM-MANAGED

- Program manages and completes construction process
- Homeowners do not select contractors or deal directly with the contractor
- The program's contractors will repair or reconstruct damaged properties

Solution 2 HOMEOWNER-MANAGED

- Homeowners manage repair or reconstruction work
- Homeowners select contractors and deal directly with the contractor
- Program provides advisory services and monitoring
- Program reimburses for economygrade finishes only but homeowner is allowed to pay the difference for higher grade materials/finishes

Solution 3 REIMBURSEMENT

 Homeowners who have completed partial or full repairs before applying to the assistance program may qualify for reimbursement of eligible expenses incurred before the application process

Limited assistance is not intended for:

Homeowners with minor damage as determined by FEMA

Homeowners who had adequate insurance to repair their homes


Replacing contents in home – funding can only be used for repairing or replacing the structure of damaged home
