Who should take the survey?

Homeowners affected by Hurricanes Laura and Delta

Completing the survey is the first step in receiving funding to repair your home.

What's the current status of the Restore Louisiana Homeowner Assistance Program for the 2020-21 disasters?

At this time, the State of Louisiana has only been allocated \$595 million in funding for all recovery needs associated with Hurricanes Laura and Delta, and additional funding is anticipated for other 2020 and 2021 disasters.

If your home received major/severe damage as determined by FEMA from any of the following disaster events, you may complete the program survey as additional funding for these disasters is anticipated:

- Hurricane Laura (2020)
- Hurricane Delta (2020)
- Hurricane Zeta (2020)* ٠
- Severe Winter Storms (February 2021)*
- Severe Storms, Tornadoes, and Flooding (May 2021)* •
- Hurricane Ida (2021)*

*Funding has not yet been allocated by Congress to HUD for these disaster events.

Homeowners who meet these basic criteria should complete the survey to potentially qualify for future program assistance:

- Owned and occupied the damaged home as your primary residence at the time of disaster and still own the damaged home
- Meet low-to-moderate income qualifications
- Have FEMA-determined major/severe structural damage

Currently, Louisiana has only been allocated funding for Hurricanes Laura and Delta.

We do anticipate additional funding for other 2020 and 2021 disasters, and by completing the survey, the program will have your information on hand if additional funding becomes available.
