









Nine years ago, the original Film Screams! repertory series curated cinematic frights from around the globe. Long thought dead, that series has been transformed and revived into a new Course on the horror film — Film Screams: Resurrection.

This five-week Course will track the major themes in one of the most popular and diverse genres in the history of filmmaking. Students will learn formal analysis to understand how filmmakers construct surprise and suspense. Additionally, we will explore the symbolism lurking beneath to gain insight into the genre's social and cultural commentary.



Film Streams is a 501(c)3 nonprofit arts organization dedicated to enhancing the cultural environment of the Omaha-Council Bluffs area through the presentation and discussion of film as an art form. Our programming takes place across two wonderful and distinct cinemas:

RUTH SOKOLOF THEATER

The two-screen (206-seat and 96-seat) cinema we opened a decade ago within the Saddle Creek Records complexlocated one block west of TD Ameritrade ballpark. Free lot parking is accessible from 14th Street between Cuming and Mike Fahey Streets. Street parking is also available in the vicinity surrounding the cinema (free after 9 pm and all day on Sunday).

ACCESSIBILITY

All public areas of the Ruth Sokolof Theater and Dundee Theater are fully accessible. The parking lots adjacent to our cinemas include reserved accessible spots, and seating at both cinemas can be reserved for patrons using wheelchairs and their parties. Assistive devices are available at both venues (Fidelio and CaptiView), and hearing loop technology is now installed at the Dundee Theater for patrons with telecoil-equipped hearing aids. 
