

Great Directors: Agnès Varda

Over a sixty-year career, Agnès Varda has created films as colorful, warm, and witty as the iconic artist herself. A founding member of the French New Wave, her 1962 dazzler **Cléo from 5 to 7** remains one of the finest examples of the movement. That film is here, as are some of Varda's California films (**Black Panthers**, **Mur Murs**), created during stints in the 60s and 80s. Also included are titles from a recent string of late-career marvels (**The Gleaners & I, Beaches of Agnès**), a streak that includes **Faces Places** — one of the inaugural films in the Dundee's new Linder Microcinema in late 2017.

In the 1980s, director Pedro Almodóvar burst onto the scene as the rebel of Spanish cinema. His frank depictions of love, lust, queerness, and womanhood fundamentally changed the film establishment and ignited a new era of Spanish filmmaking.

This five-week Course is an in-depth study of Almodóvar's work. We will discuss the recurring themes and stylistic signatures that define his films, and learn about the political atmosphere that fueled the creation of one of cinema's most acclaimed directors.

ACCESSIBILITY

All public areas of the Ruth Sokolof Theater and Dundee Theater are fully accessible The parking lots adjacent to our cinemas include reserved accessible spots, and seating at both cinemas can be reserved for patrons using wheelchairs and their parties. Assistive devices are available at both venues (Fidelio and CaptiView), and hearing loop technology is now installed at the Dundee Theater for patrons with telecoil-equipped hearing aids. 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
