

"They don't review my work," Orson Welles once said of his critics, "they review me." One of the great showmen of the 20th century, Welles was a prodigy of both the stage and radio before he made his groundbreaking entrance into cinema, at age 26, with what many consider the greatest film of all time. Produced, directed, co-written, and starring Welles himself, CITIZEN KANE changed the medium forever and launched one of the most brilliant and provocative careers in movie history. Critics would argue Welles never made another CITIZEN KANE again, and that's true; instead, he made THE MAGNIFICENT AMBERSONS, THE STRANGER, THE LADY FROM SHANGHAI, TOUCH OF EVIL, THE TRIAL,

terpieces all and the distinctive work of a genius auteur. The list of films could go on, and this series could be twice as long as it is. Due in part to a lack of quality available 35mm prints, Welles's extraordinary adaptations of Shakespeare (MACBETH, OTHELLO, CHIMES AT MIDNIGHT) are not included here, though we certainly hope to feature them in a Shakespeare on Film series down the line.
