whether you've seen all of his films or not a one (yet!), his place in our vocabulary speaks volumes of his legendary career and towering influence over the art form. While a prominent figure in the post-war Italian neorealism movement, he was more important in diverging from it—making movies in which the realities and fantasies of his iconic characters (the amazing Marcello Mastroianni, Giulietta Masina, and Anouk Aimee among his collaborators) blend together into something surrealistically sublime. For lack of a better word: Felliniesque. Among his most beloved works (LA STRADA, LA DOLCE VITA, AMARCORD), 8 ½ stands out as one of the absolute most essential films of all time, a meta-masterpiece made at a personal and creative crossroads in Fellini's life and as innovative, playful, and rewarding as anything you'll ever see on the big screen. In an era when directors, especially in Europe, were treated like royalty, nothing was as

exciting culturally as the release of a new Fellini picture. With this series, we



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relive that time—presenting ten of Fellini's greatest films, a documentary about his life and career (FELLINI: I'M A BORN LIAR), and another landmark of Italian cinema (Roberto Rossellini's ROME, OPEN CITY) co-written by a young screenwriter who would go on to collect a staggering thirteen Academy Award nominations over the course of his career before finally taking home one of the most deserved Lifetime Achievement Awards in Oscar history. 
